- Supporting CHCs in maintaining the highest quality care.*



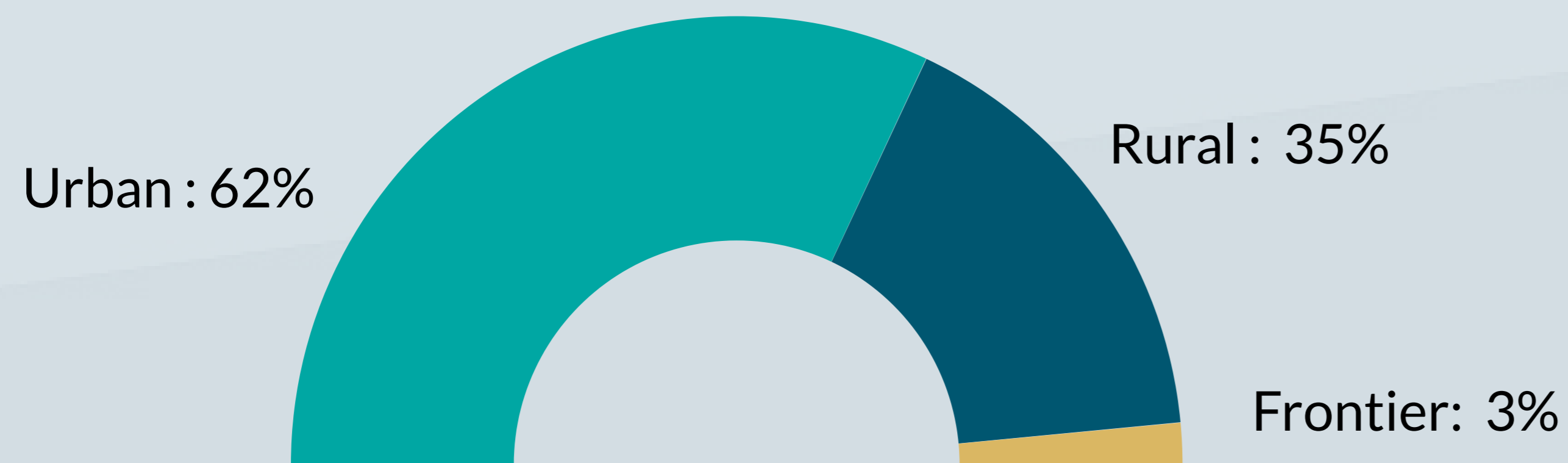
ABOUT COLORADO'S CHCs

20 Community Health Centers (CHCs) operate more than 240 clinic sites across Colorado, providing health care to more than 832,000 patients.*

CHCs provide patient-centered, comprehensive primary care:



CHCs are located in areas where access to affordable care is limited***



CHCs see patients regardless of ability to pay or insurance status

88% of CHC patients fall at or below 200% of the Federal Poverty Level**

CHCs are also called Federally Qualified Health Centers (FQHCs) and receive this federal designation because they are governed by five core principles:

- Serve all patients regardless of ability to pay for services.
- Located in high-need areas.
- Provide comprehensive primary health care.
- Governed by community boards - at least 51% of board members must be patients.
- Operate as nonprofits or public agencies with a mission to provide health care to low-income, working families.

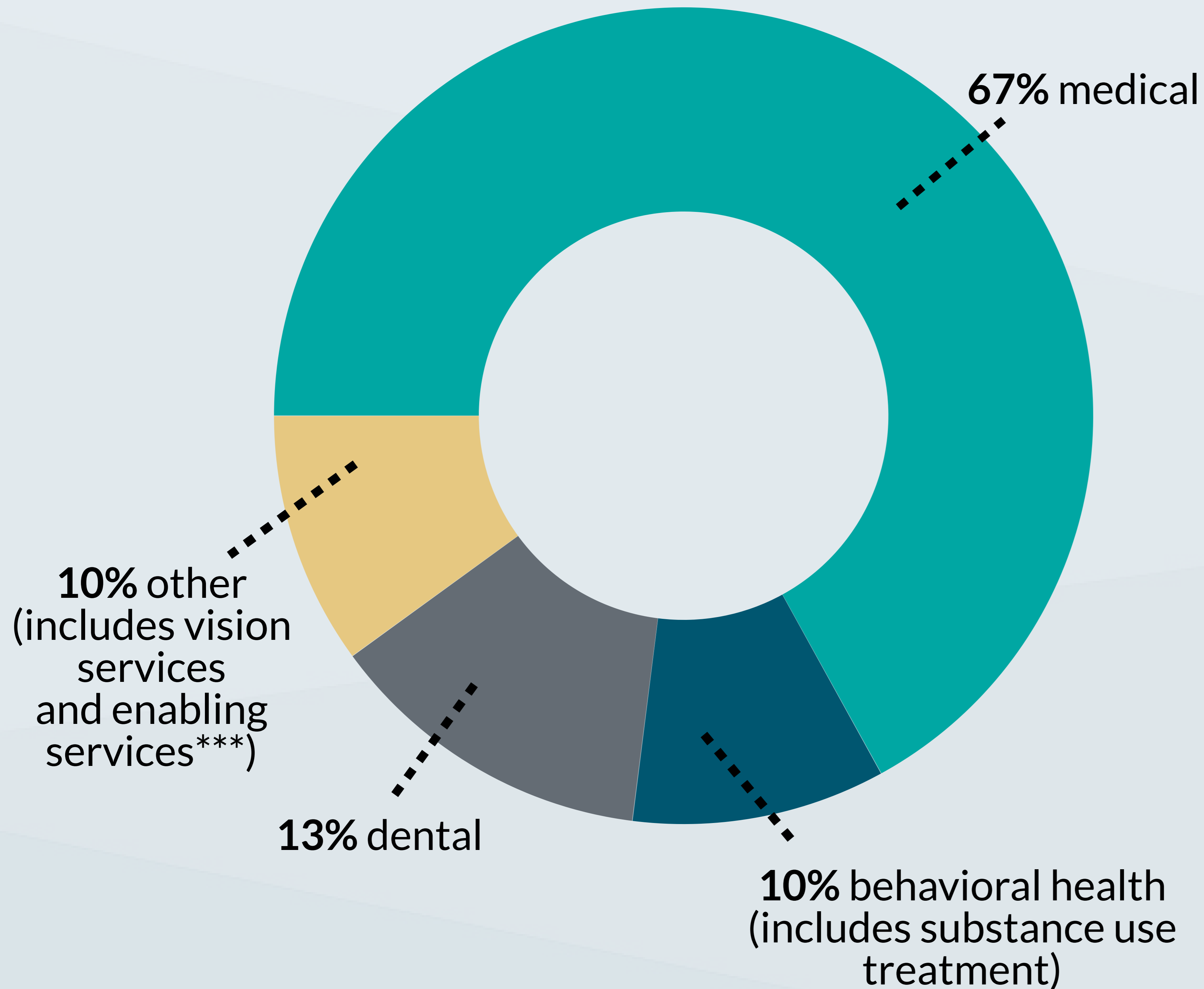

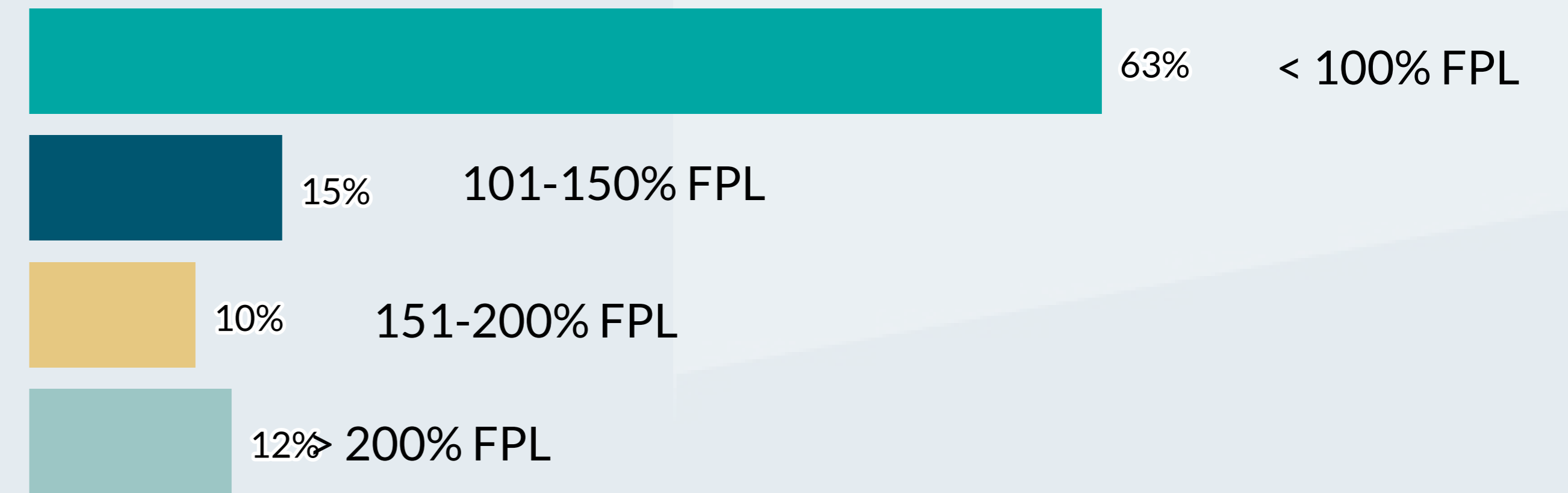

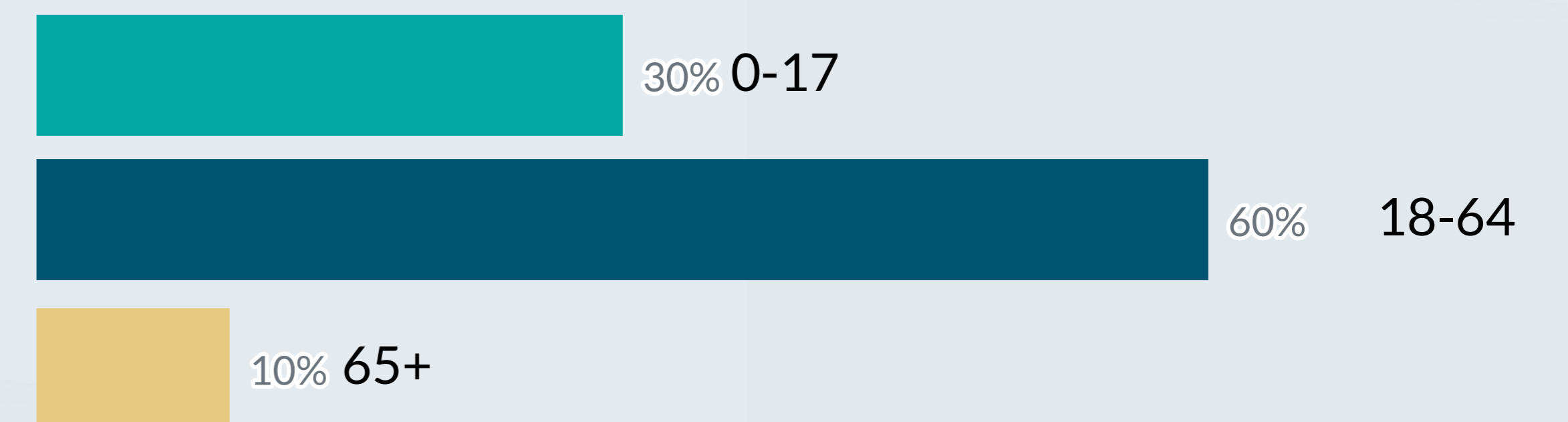
Patient income level

% of patients in age groups



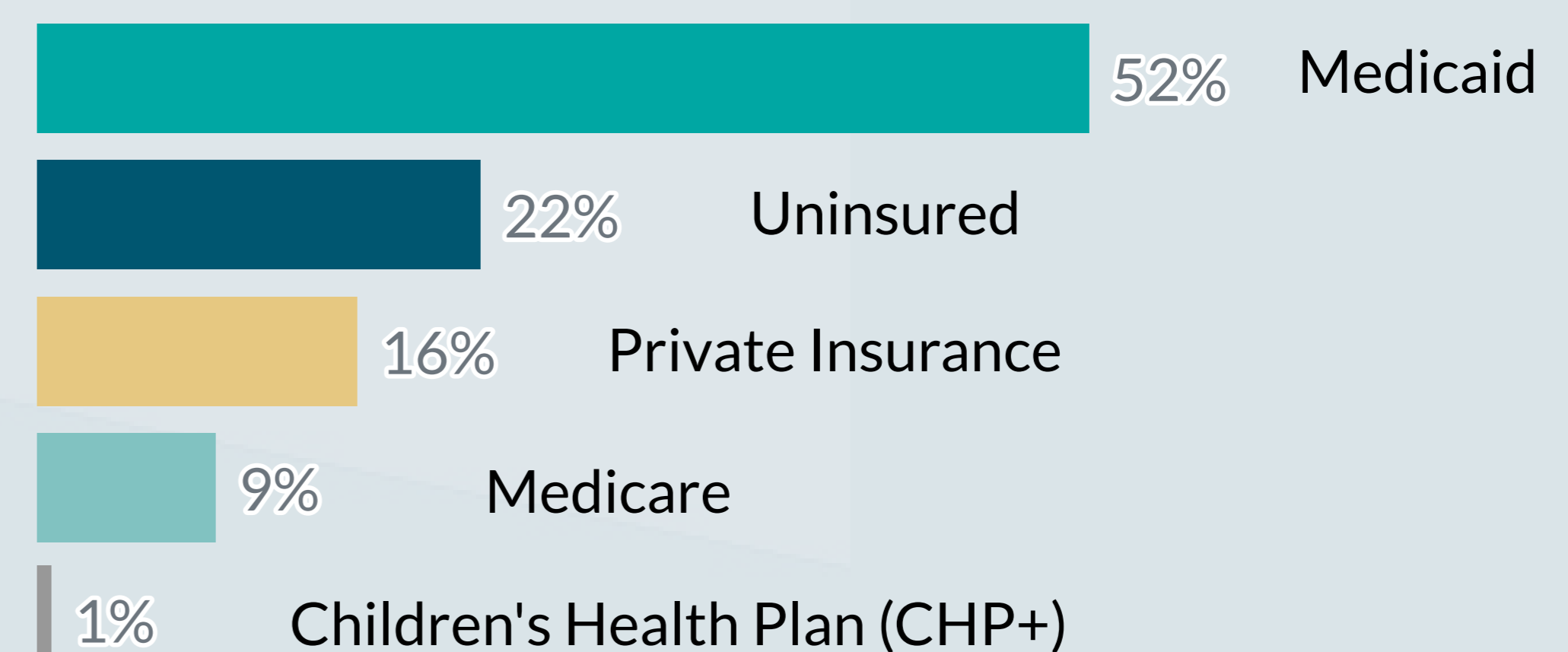
Race

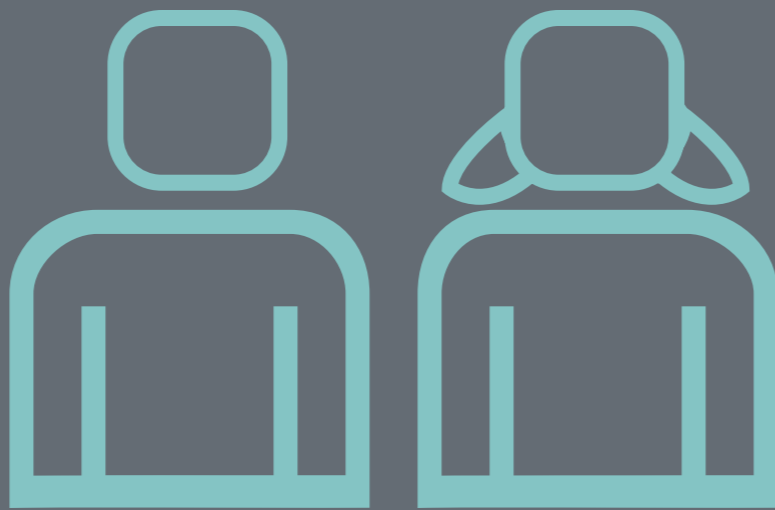

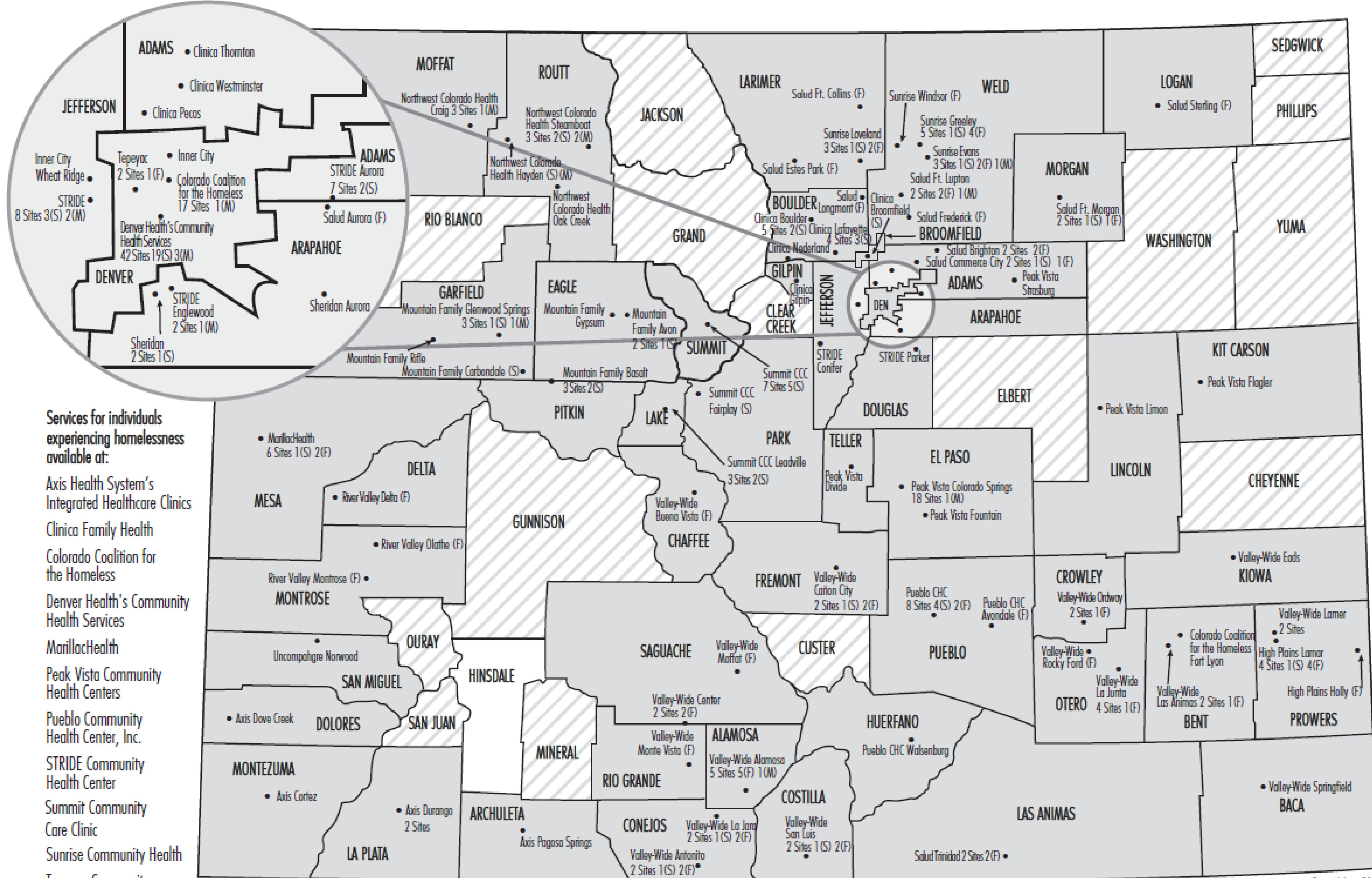

Axis Health System (Axis) began in 1960 as a small Community Mental Health Center, later expanding to become a licensed Substance Use Disorder Treatment Provider and a HRSA-designated Community Health Center (CHC), the only organization in the state with all three designations. Axis is a leader in treating the whole person through an integrated care model. This includes primary, oral, and behavioral health care all in the same visit. Axis also offers health insurance outreach and enrollment assistance to patients.

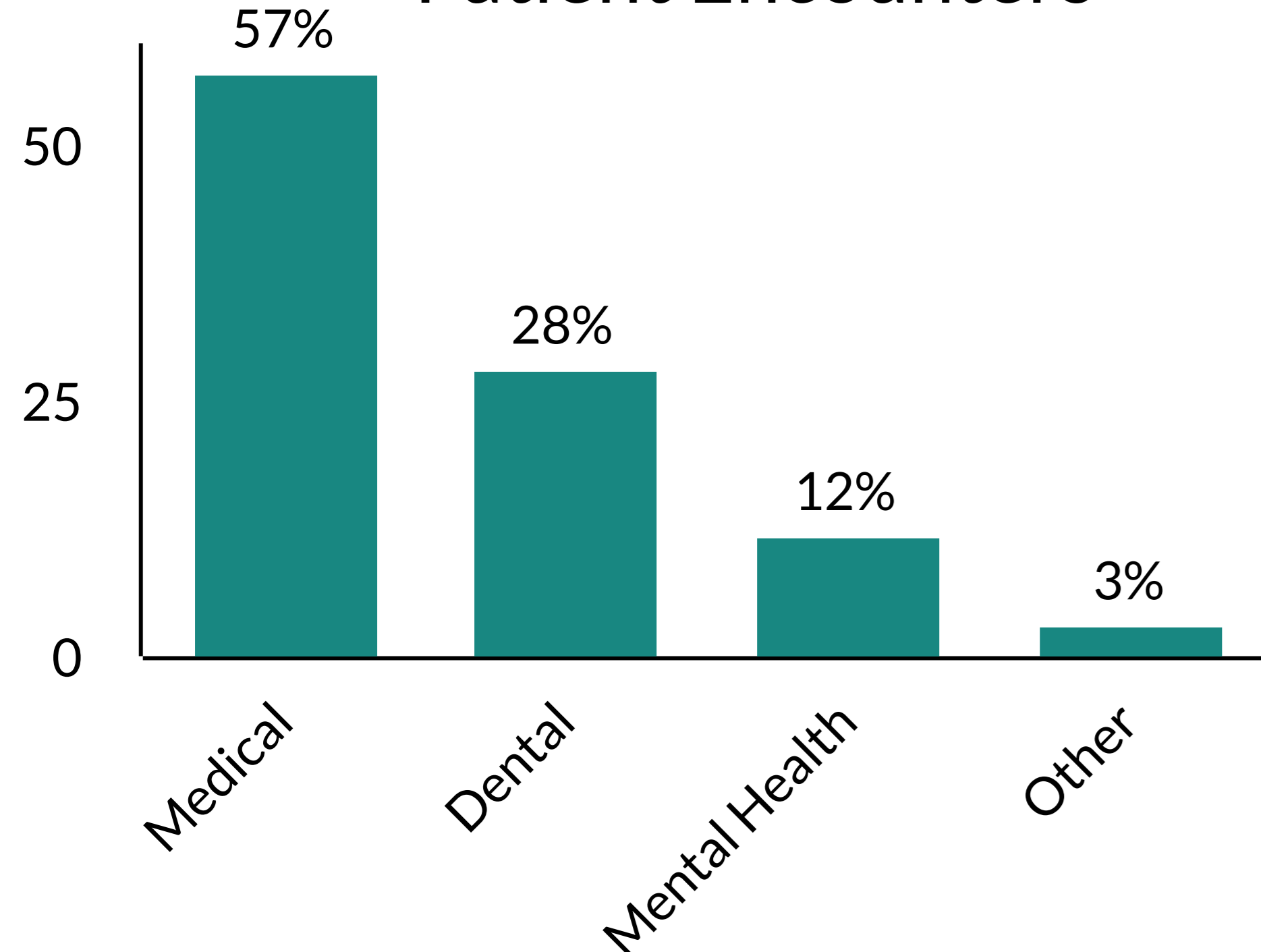
In May 2020, Frontier Community Health Clinic in Dove Creek merged with Axis, expanding Axis' ability to serve even more Coloradans. On July 1, 2022, The Center for Mental Health merged with Axis, expanding the reach of mental health services in the region. Axis now has 18 clinic locations, including six federally qualified CHC clinic sites.



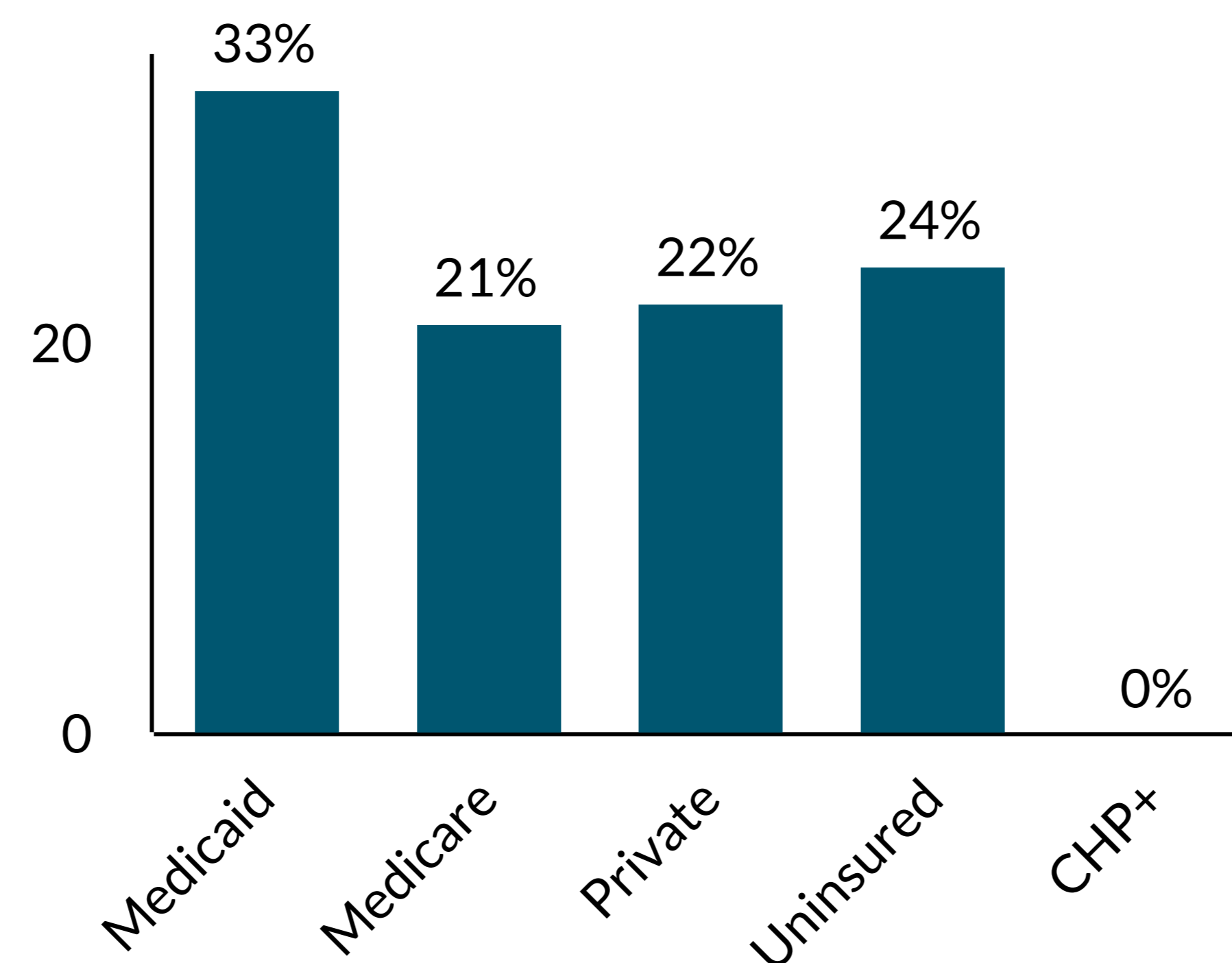

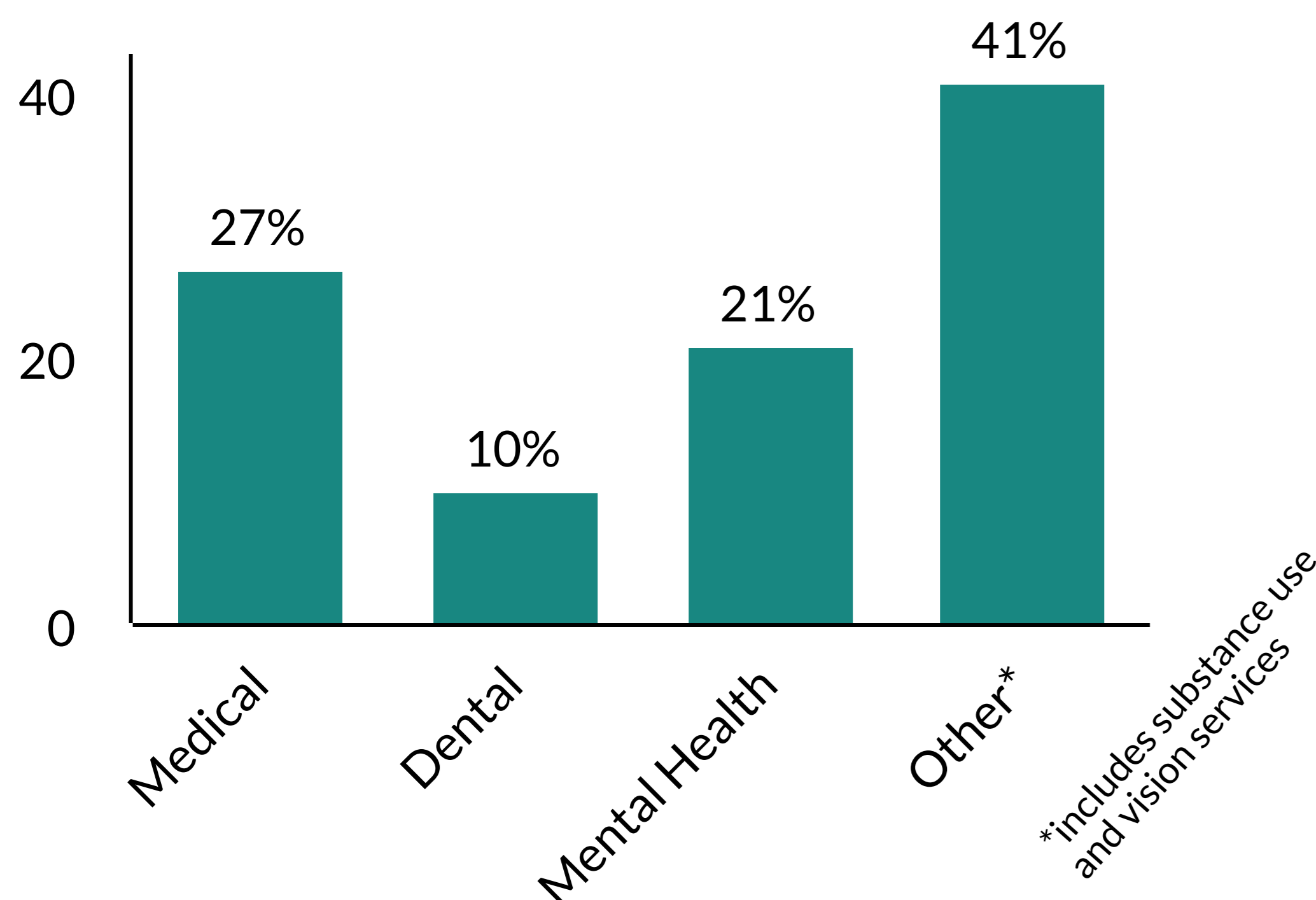
Colorado Coalition for the Homeless (the Coalition) was established in 1984. The mission of the Coalition is to work toward the prevention of homelessness and the creation of lasting solutions for people experiencing and at-risk of homelessness throughout Colorado. The Coalition advocates for and provides a continuum of housing and a variety of services to improve the health, well-being, and stability of those it serves. Since its founding almost 40 years ago, the Coalition has earned state and national recognition for its integrated health care, housing, and service programs. Each year, the Coalition provides integrated primary care, behavioral health, dental, and vision, as well as housing and other supportive services to roughly 15,000 men, women, and children experiencing homelessness.



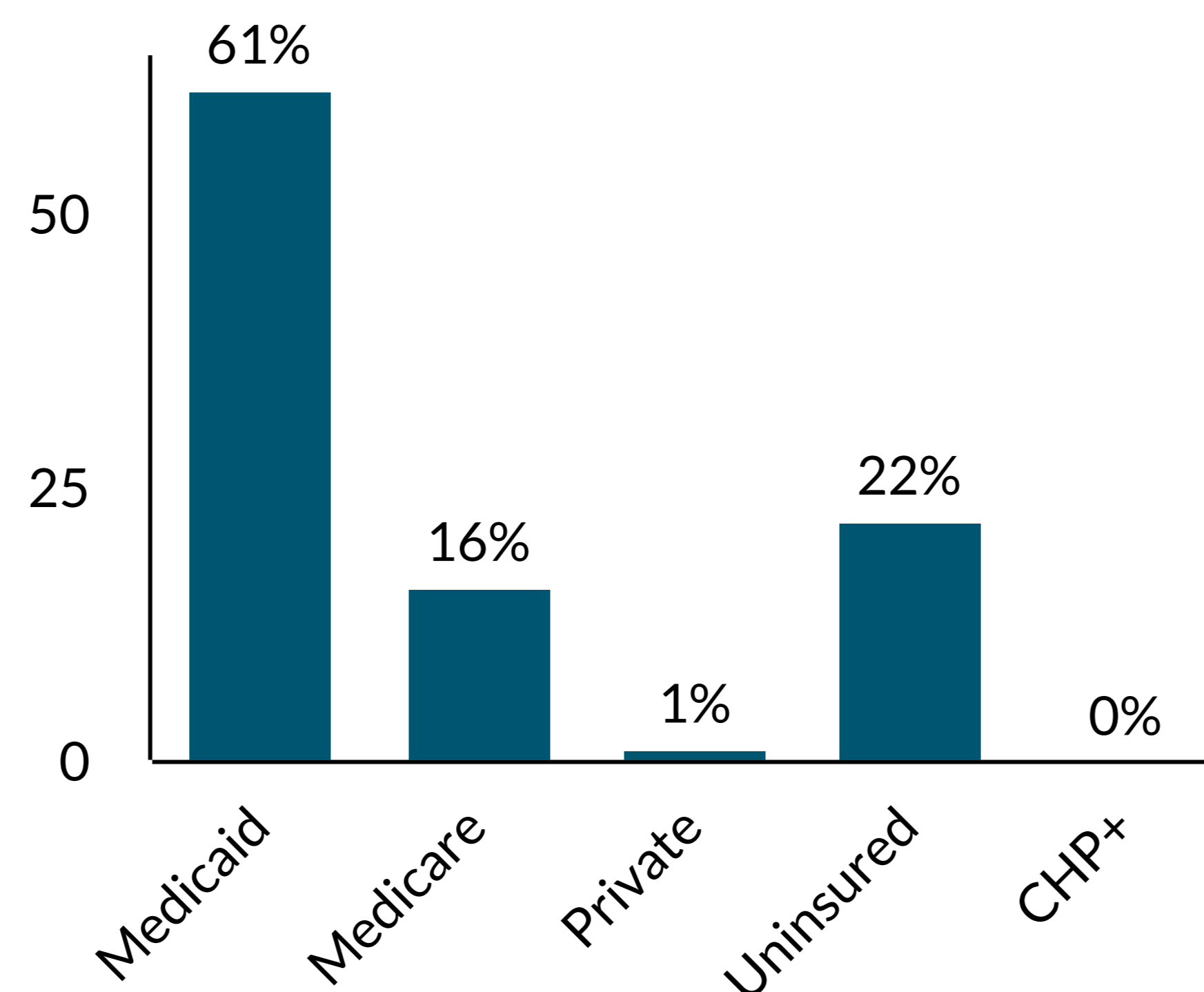

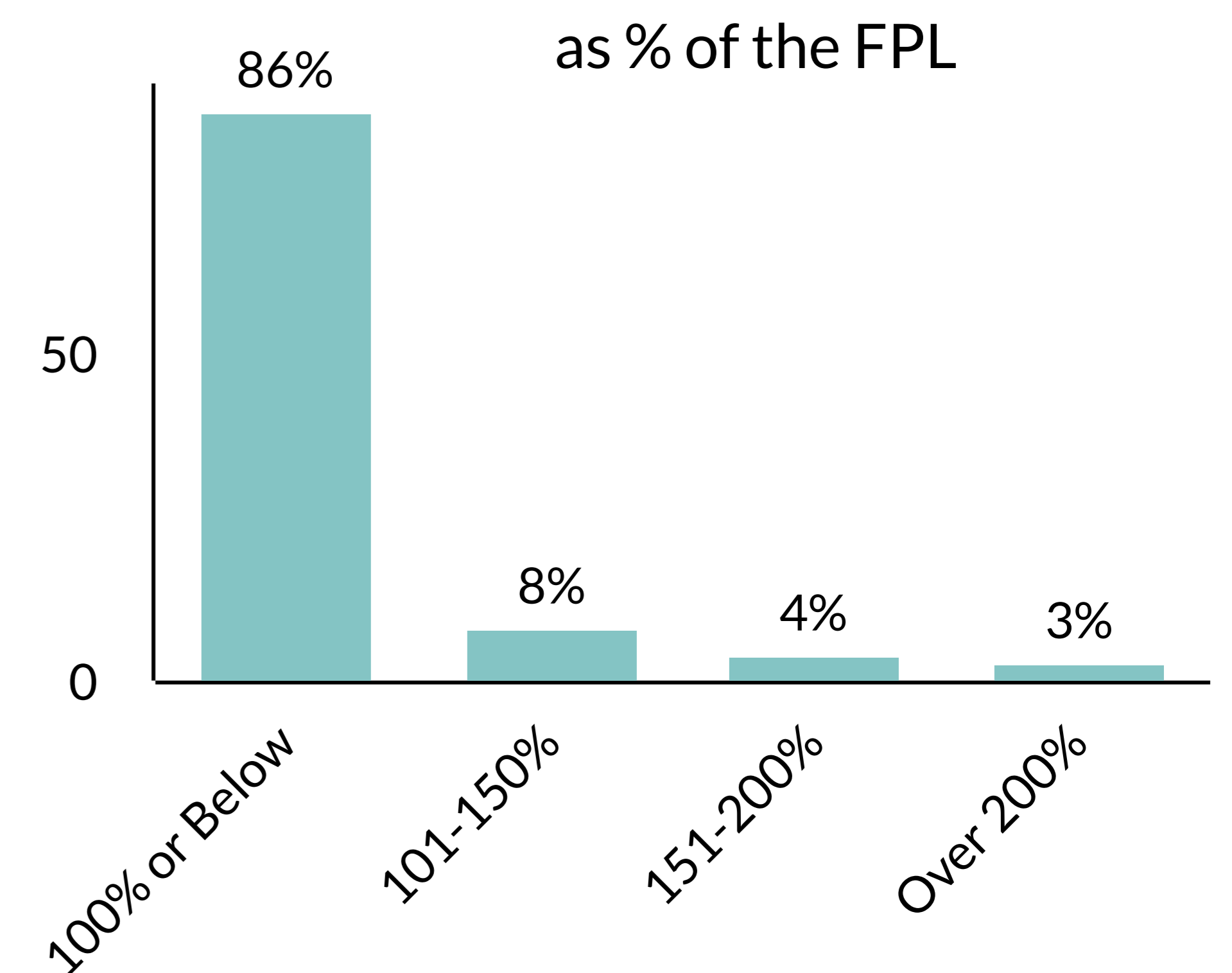

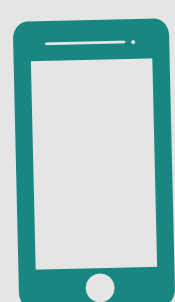
Patient Income Levels

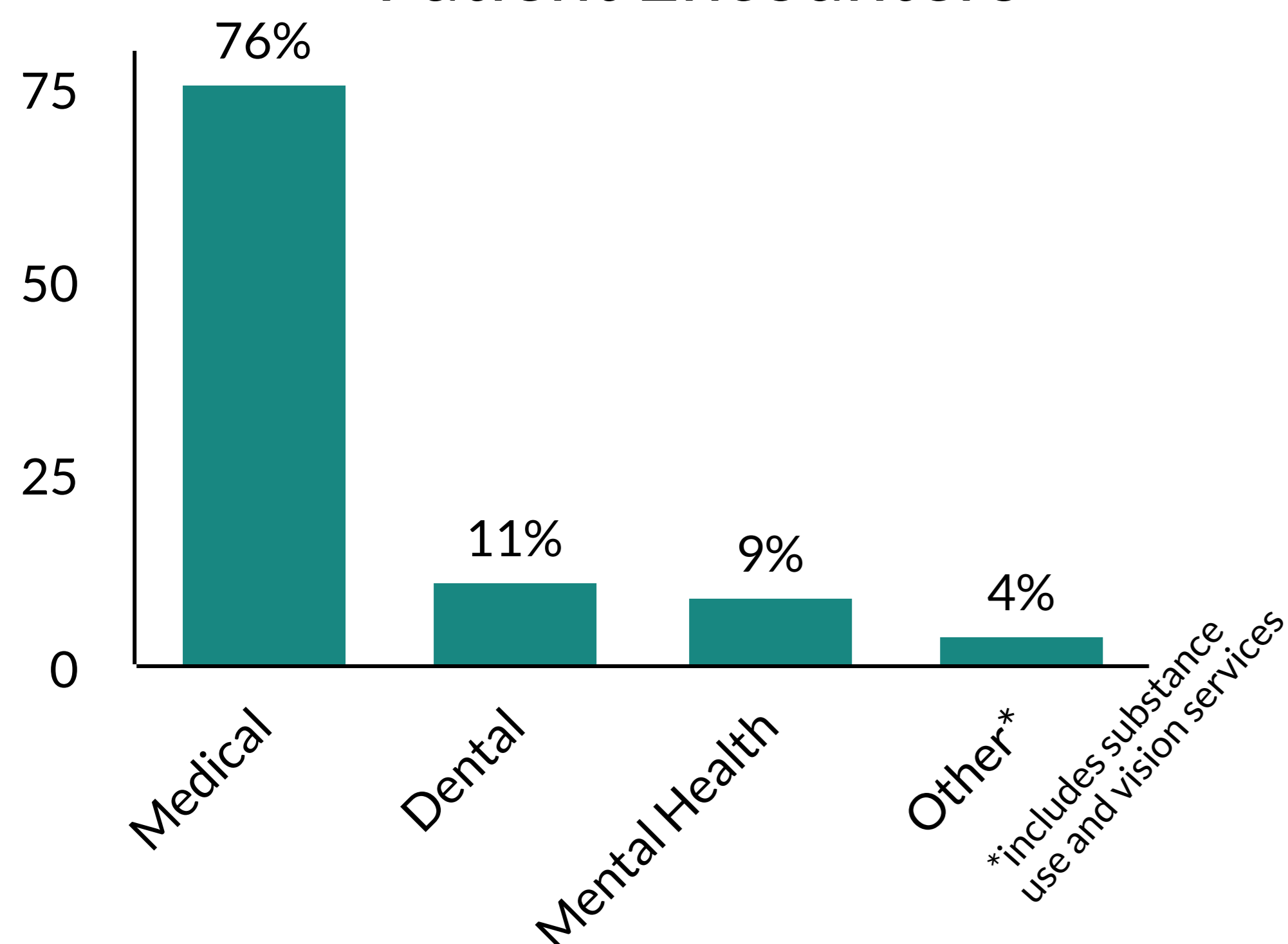
Founded in 1966, Denver Health's Community Health Services (DCHS) network includes 12 Community Health Centers, three urgent care centers, three mobile Health Centers, and 19 School-Based Health Centers located throughout the Denver metro area. Each DCHS Health Center provides family care services for adults and children of all ages, as well as pharmacy and lab services. DCHS provides preventive and community services vital to Denver residents, including dental care, integrated behavioral health, immunization outreach clinics, Head Start clinics, Women Infants and Children (WIC) program services, and outreach and insurance enrollment services. DCHS trains dental residents (adult and pediatric), medical assistant and dental assistant students, residents in pediatrics, internal medicine, family medicine, OB/Gyn, and Medicine-Pediatrics.



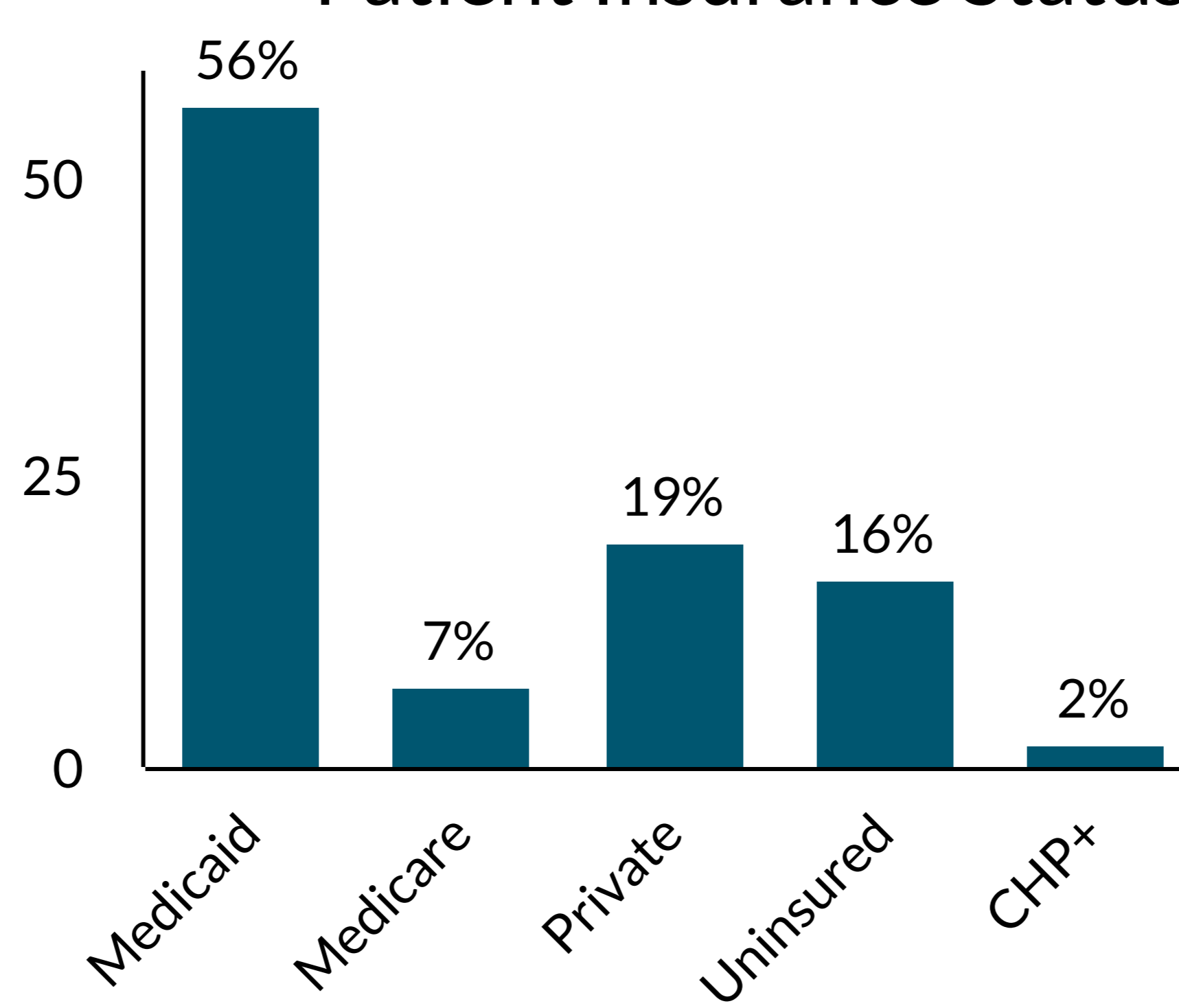

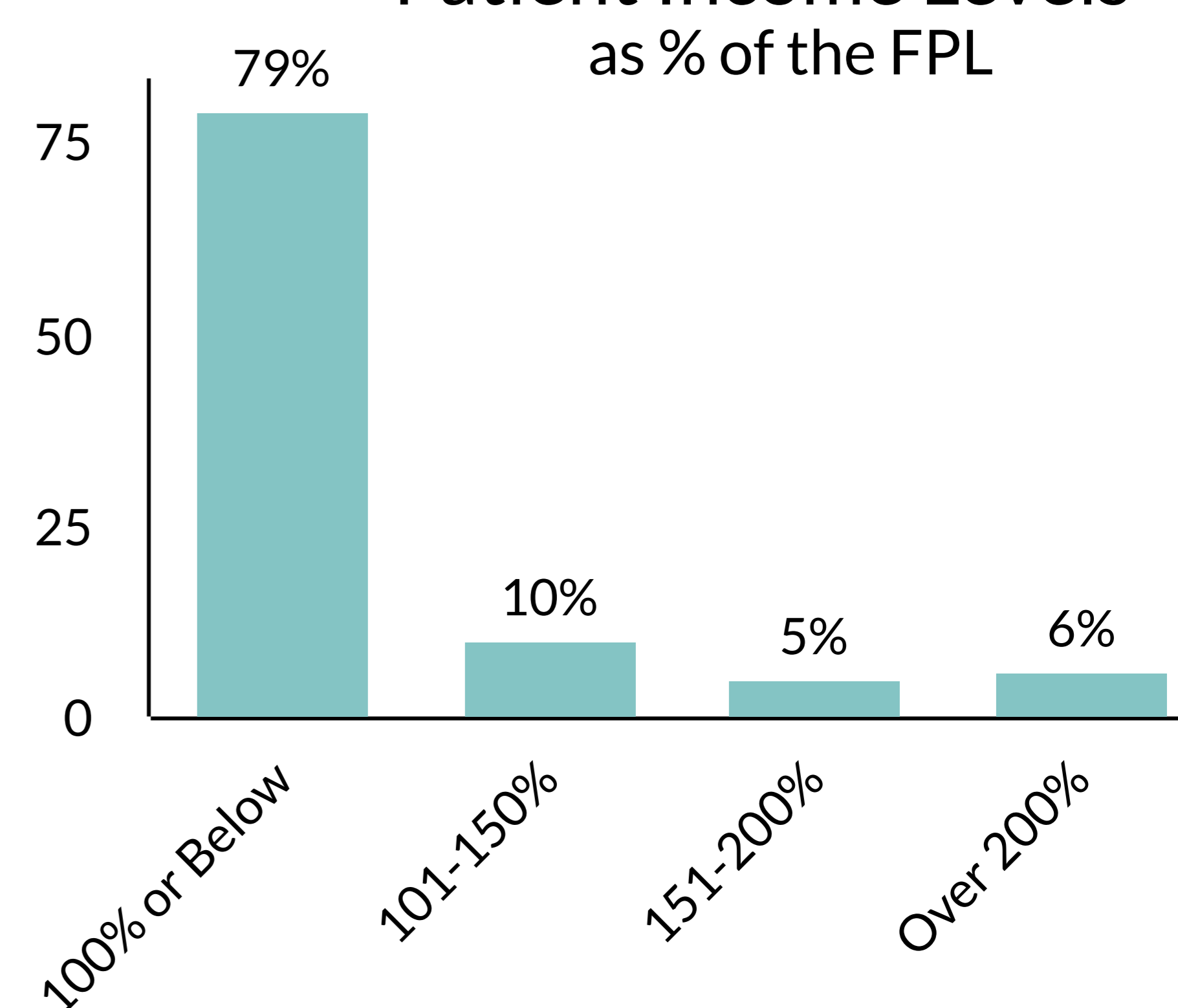

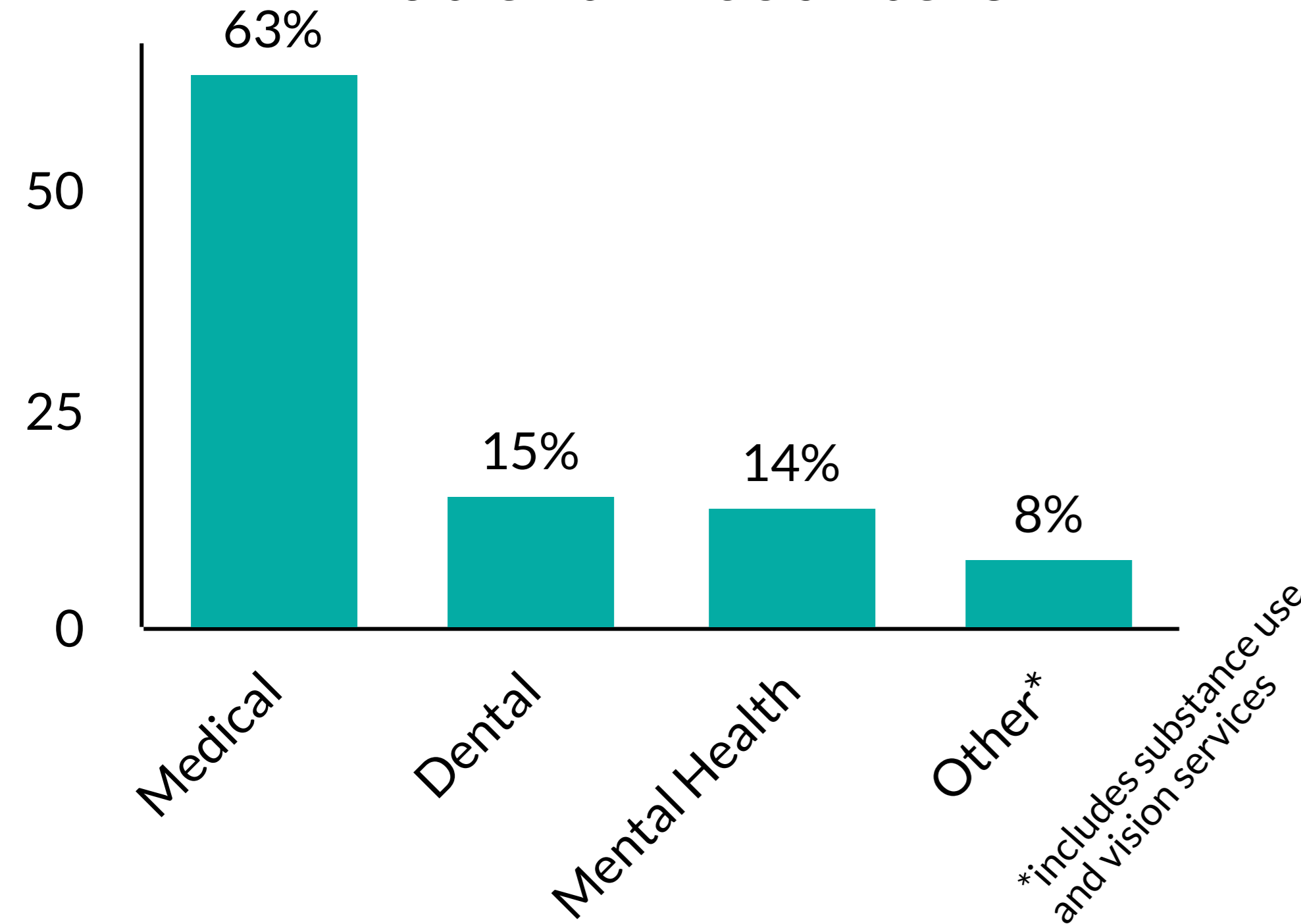
High Plains Community Health Center (High Plains) opened its doors in 1995 with the mission to provide accessible health care for rural communities on the eastern plains of Colorado. High Plains specifically targets underserved populations for access to care but serves all community members. The methodology used to ensure access includes a sliding fee scale based on income for all medical, dental and mental health services, Spanish competency including several providers fluent in Spanish, free transportation, eligibility workers to qualify patients for the sliding fee scale and assist with Medicaid and Child Health Plan *Plus* (CHP+) applications, many free preventive services such as colonoscopies, women's services, evening clinics for migrant farm workers, evening and all-day Saturday clinics, and affordable medications. High Plains operates out of five sites including the Main Clinic, Adult Health Center, Family Health Center, Lamar Community College Campus Health, and the Holly Clinic.



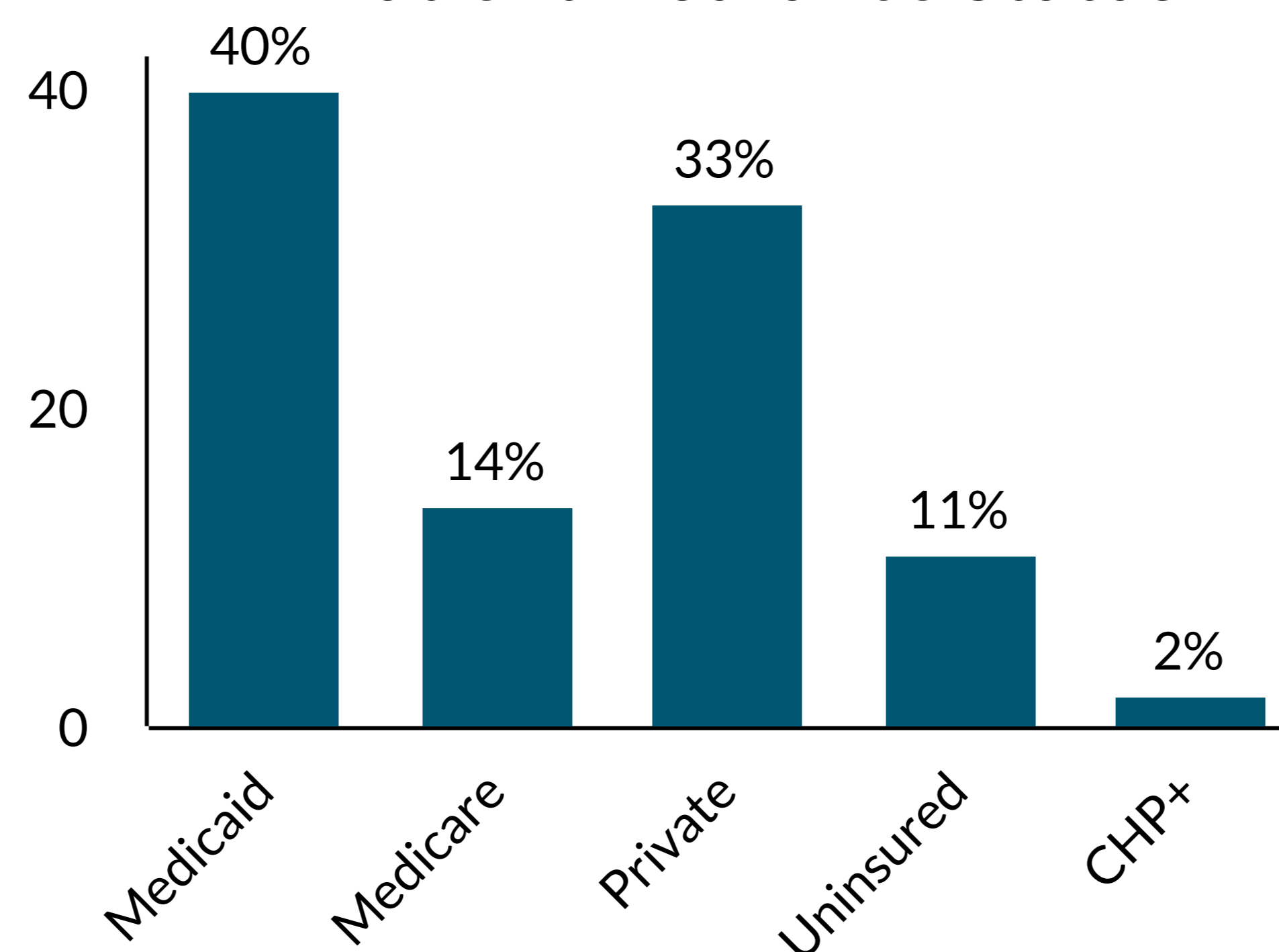

MarillacHealth (Marillac) was established as a safety-net clinic in 1988, sponsored by St. Mary's Hospital and the Sisters of Charity of Leavenworth Health System with the goal of providing care to low-income, uninsured residents of Mesa County. Awarded FQHC status in 2015, Marillac's team-based care model of primary medical and integrated behavioral health care is designed to care for the whole patient, regardless of their income or insurance status. In addition, Marillac is dedicated to providing comprehensive dental care services to the entire family, from babies to seniors. For over 36 years, Marillac has been the primary safety net clinic and health care home for community members of Mesa County who might not otherwise have access to care. A safety net provider in Montrose joined Marillac end of December 2023. Marillac operates four clinic sites, two outreach sites and a School-Based Health Center to over 12,000+ individuals annually.

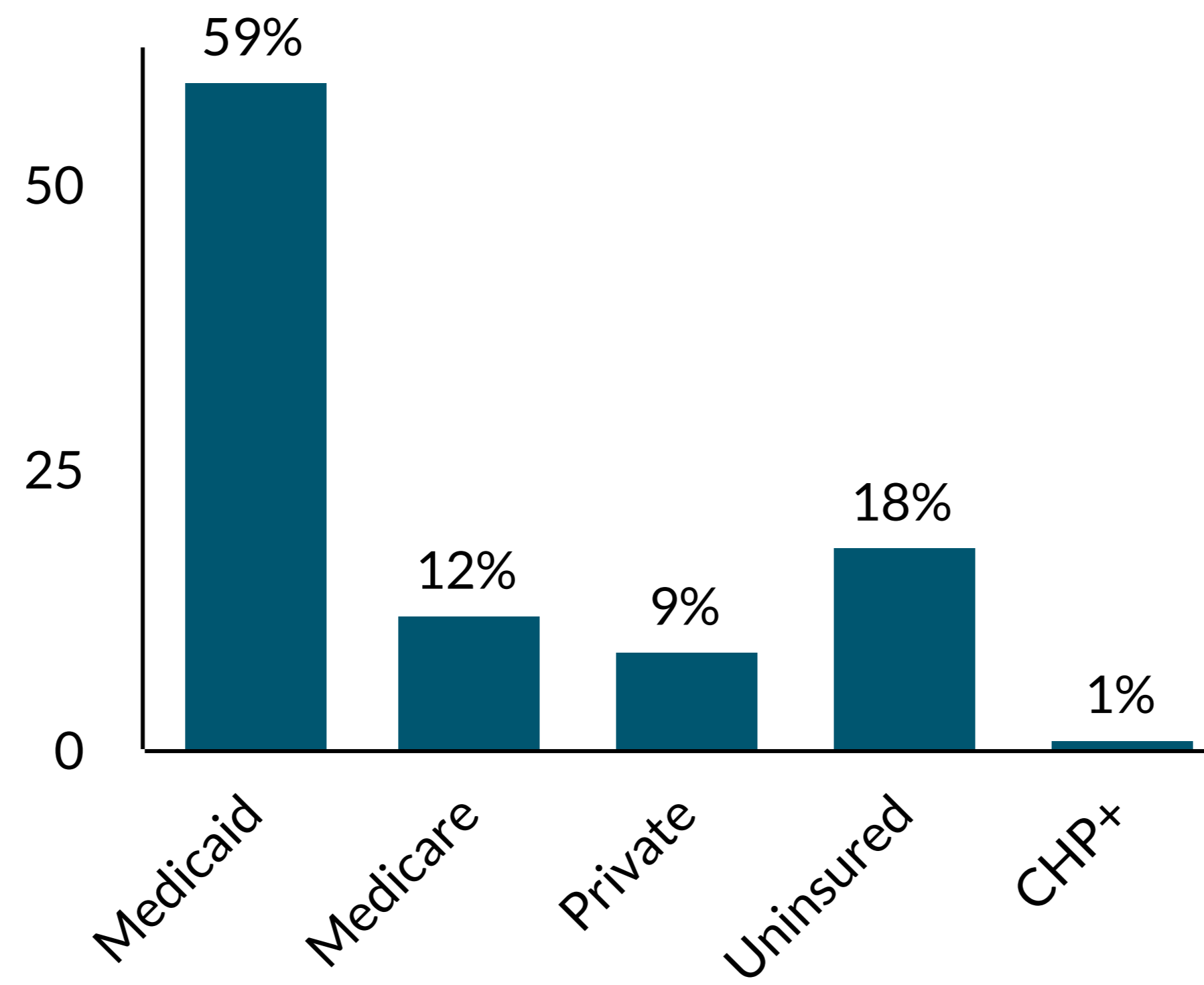

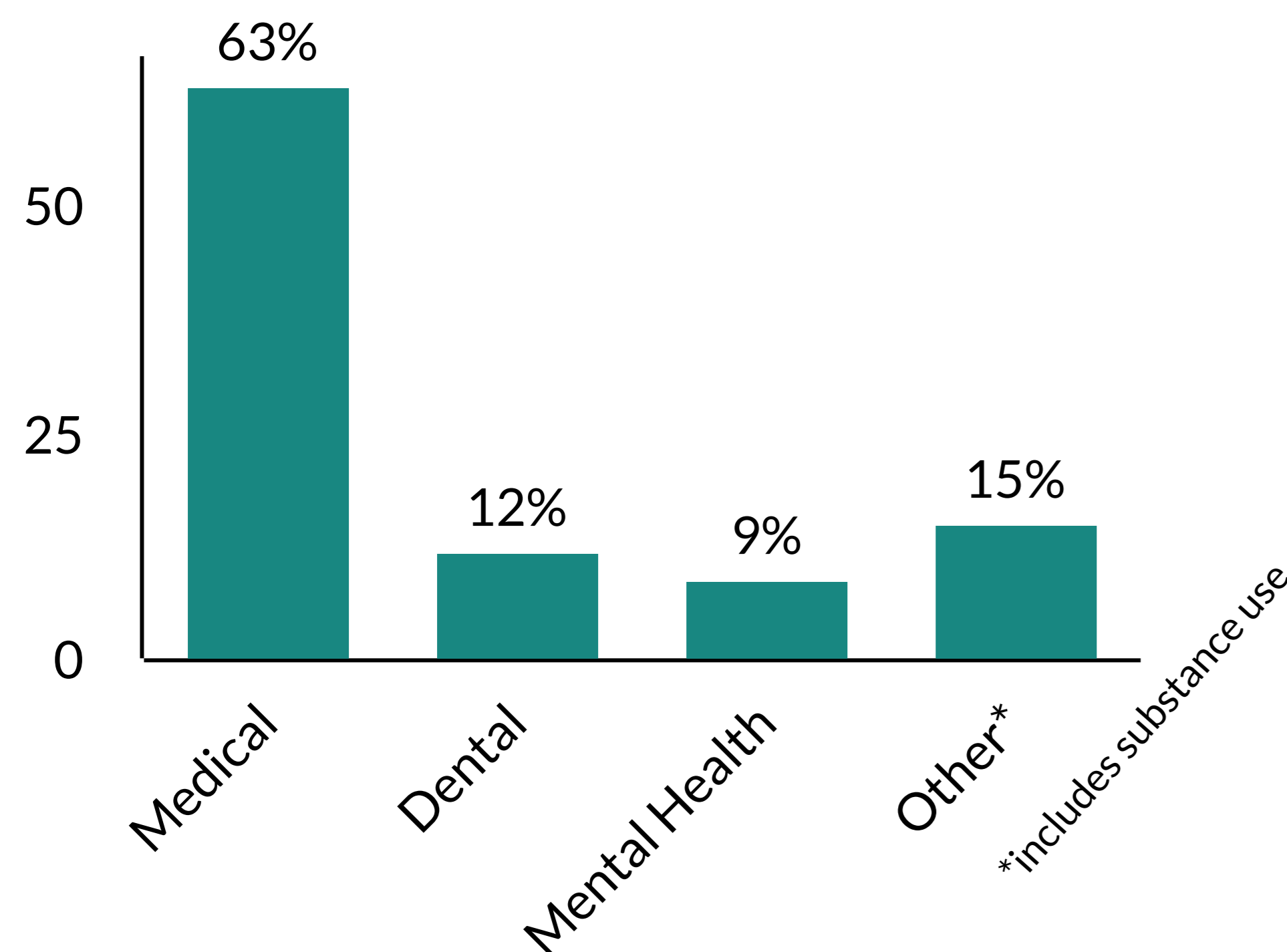
Founded in 1978, Mountain Family Health Centers (Mountain Family) improves the health of their community by providing equitable and affordable medical, behavioral, and dental health care for all. Mountain Family serves over 21,000 patients at Mountain Family's ten Community Health Center sites (including five School-Based Health Centers) with integrated health care. Mountain family provides extensive care coordination, affordable family planning, pediatric care and outreach and enrollment services for insurance and financial assistance programs. Mountain Family has added discount pharmacy services at its sites, providing life-saving medications to its uninsured and low-income patients at cents on the dollar. Mountain Family saves the West Mountain region it serves an estimated \$18.1 million in health costs annually by providing affordable primary care, reducing chronic illness burden, and limiting unnecessary health care spending. Donations to Mountain Family's Health For All Fund also help provide care to all, regardless of insurance status.



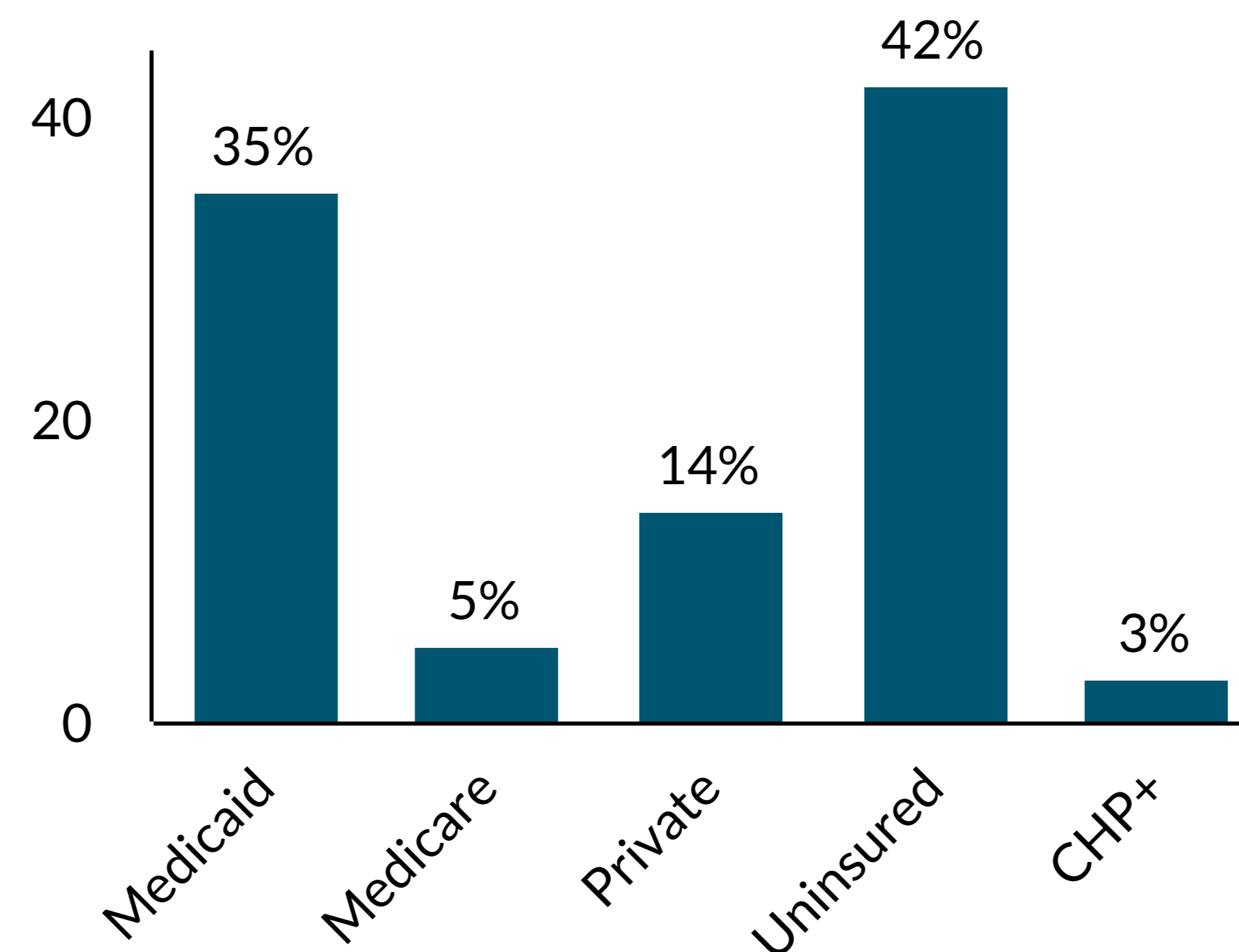

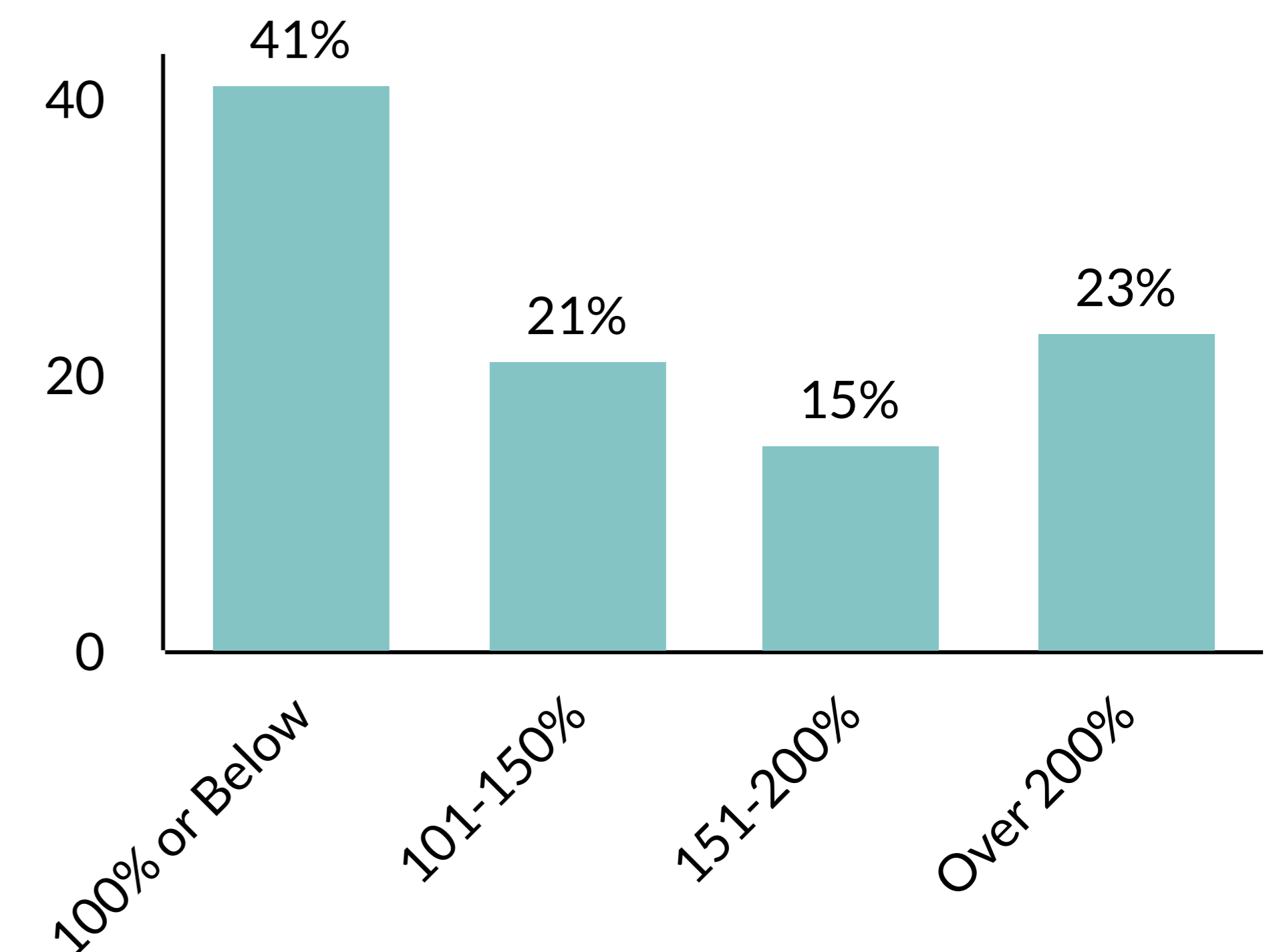

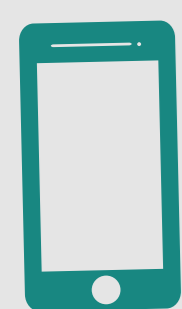
Patient Income Levels as % of the FPL

In 2005, Northwest Colorado Health (Northwest) took over a small community clinic in Craig and grew it into a Community Health Center, which became a designated federally qualified Community Health Center (FQHC) in August 2008. In 2013, Northwest opened a second FQHC in Steamboat Springs. The organization began operating a standalone dental clinic in Craig in 2017, a second dental clinic in Oak Creek in 2018, and in 2021 began offering school-based dental services via a mobile unit.

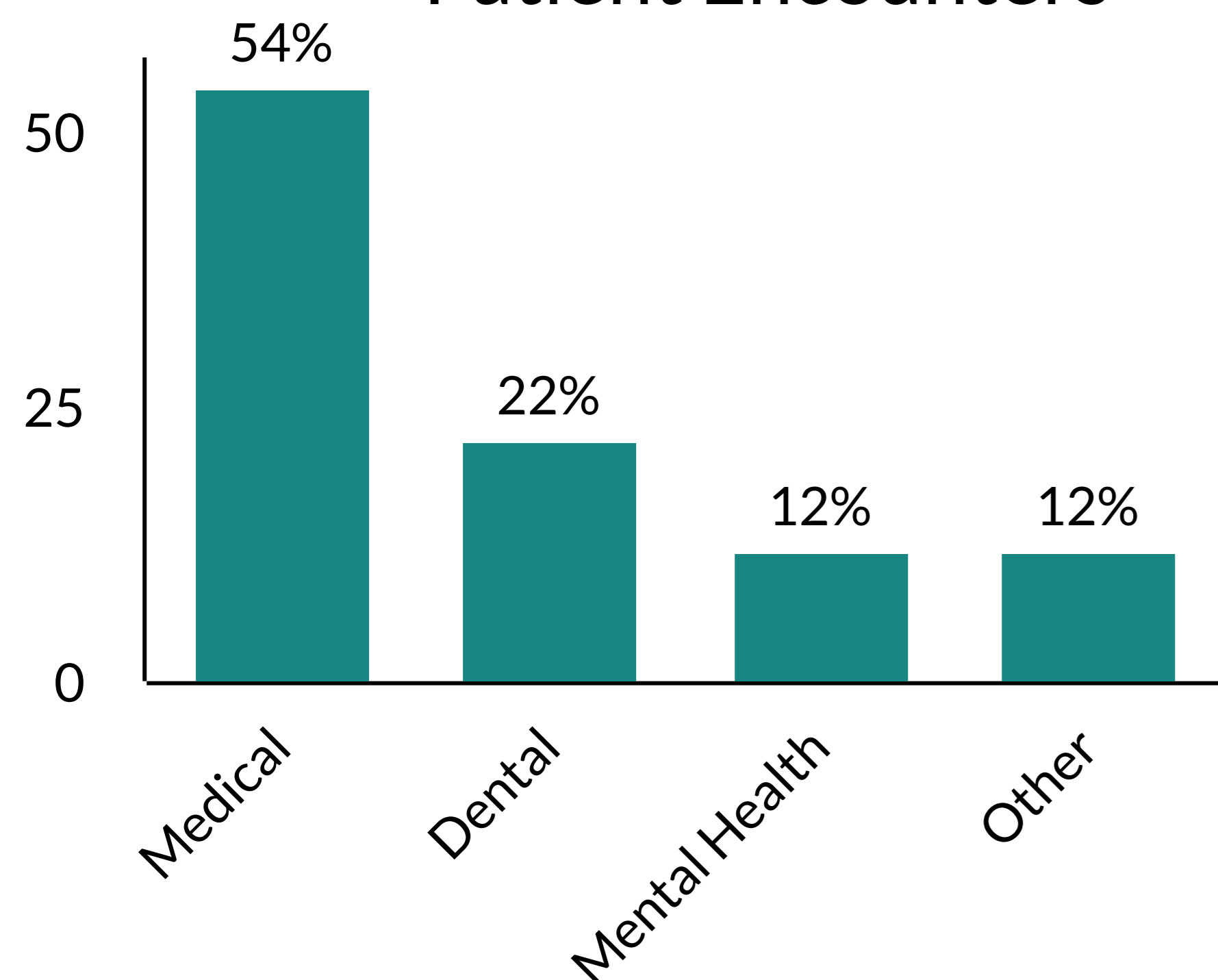
Northwest has successfully integrated behavioral health and dental health with primary care, working in close cooperation with chronic disease management and prevention programs. They use a team-based model to allow for better utilization of limited resources. The Northwest team is proud of their achievements and looks forward to continuing to build capacity to serve growing communities in Northwest Colorado.



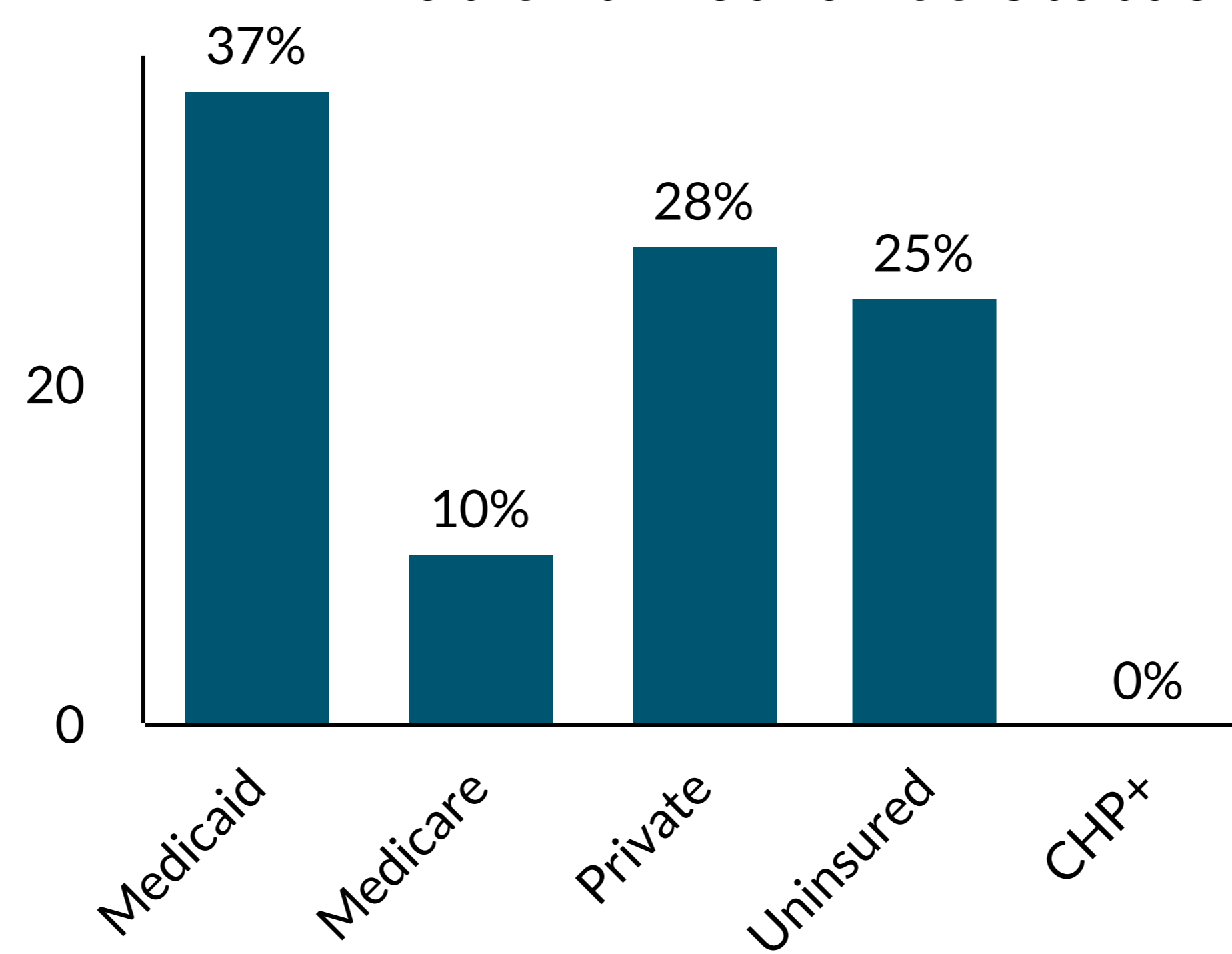

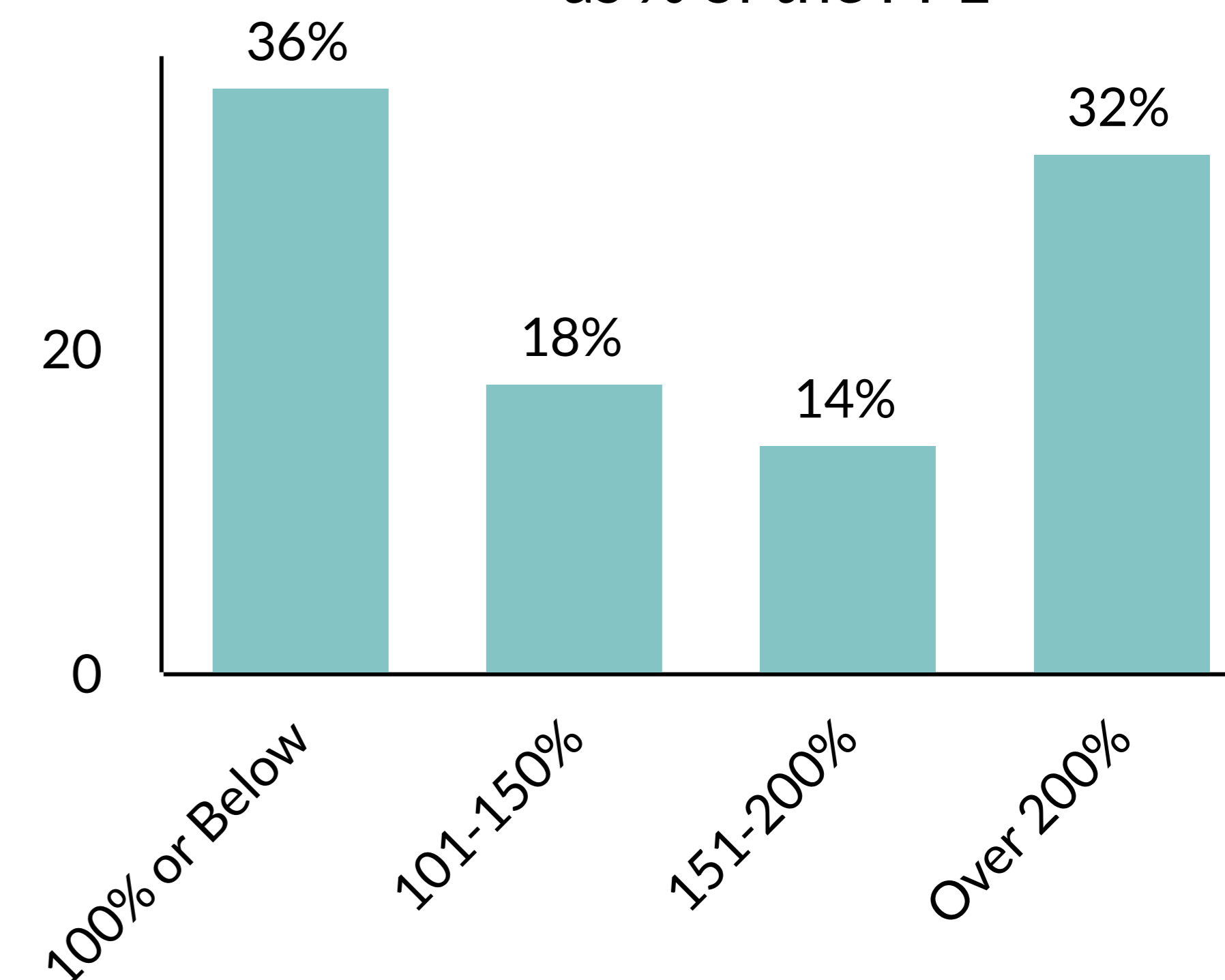

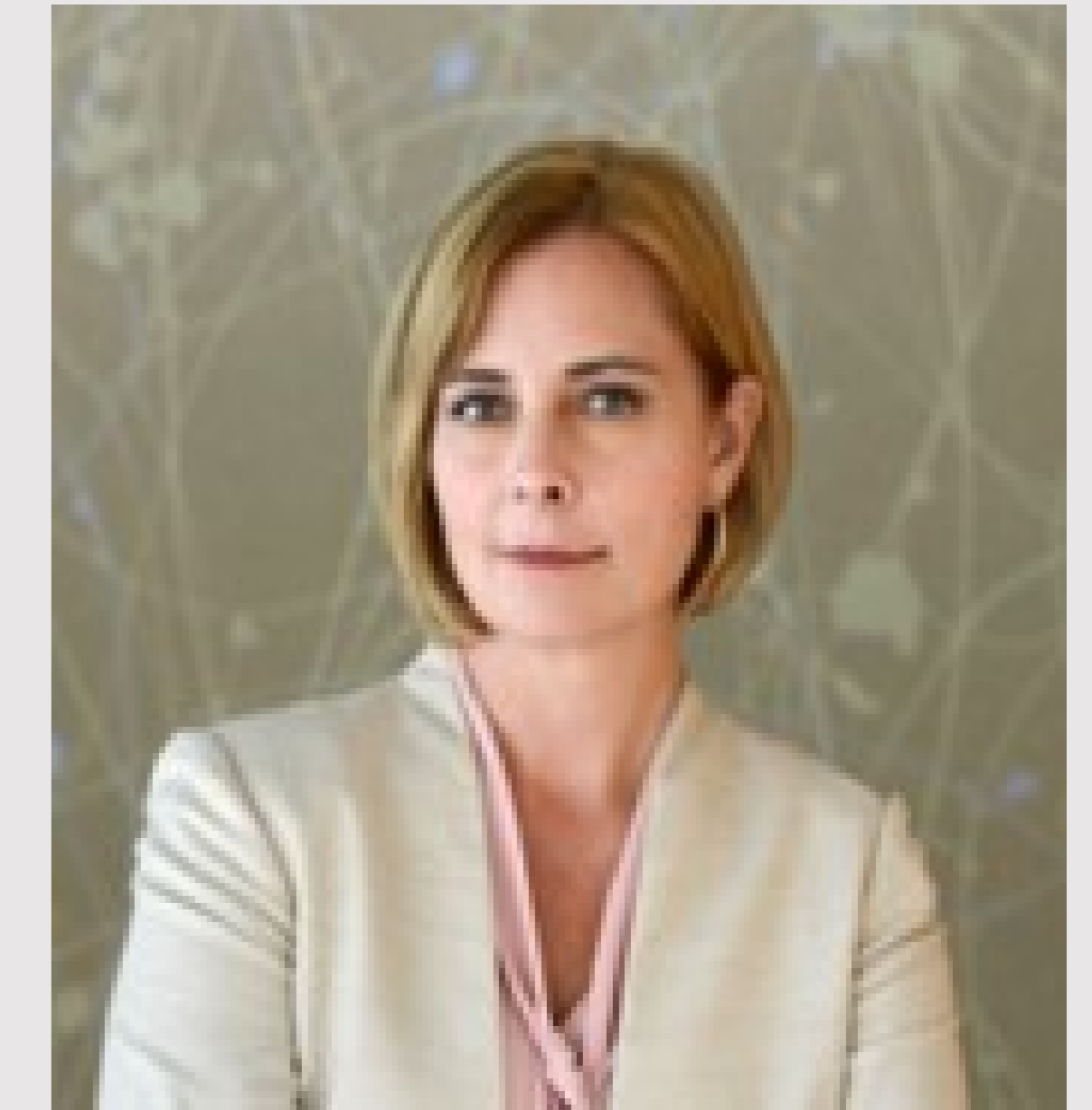

Founded in 1971, Peak Vista Community Health Centers (Peak Vista) is dedicated to whole-person integrated services that include medical, dental, and behavioral health care; care coordination; and two 340B pharmacies with a leading-edge diabetes management program. Other specialty clinics include care for adults with intellectual and developmental disabilities; expanded mental health services; and a community health workers program to meet patients where they are.

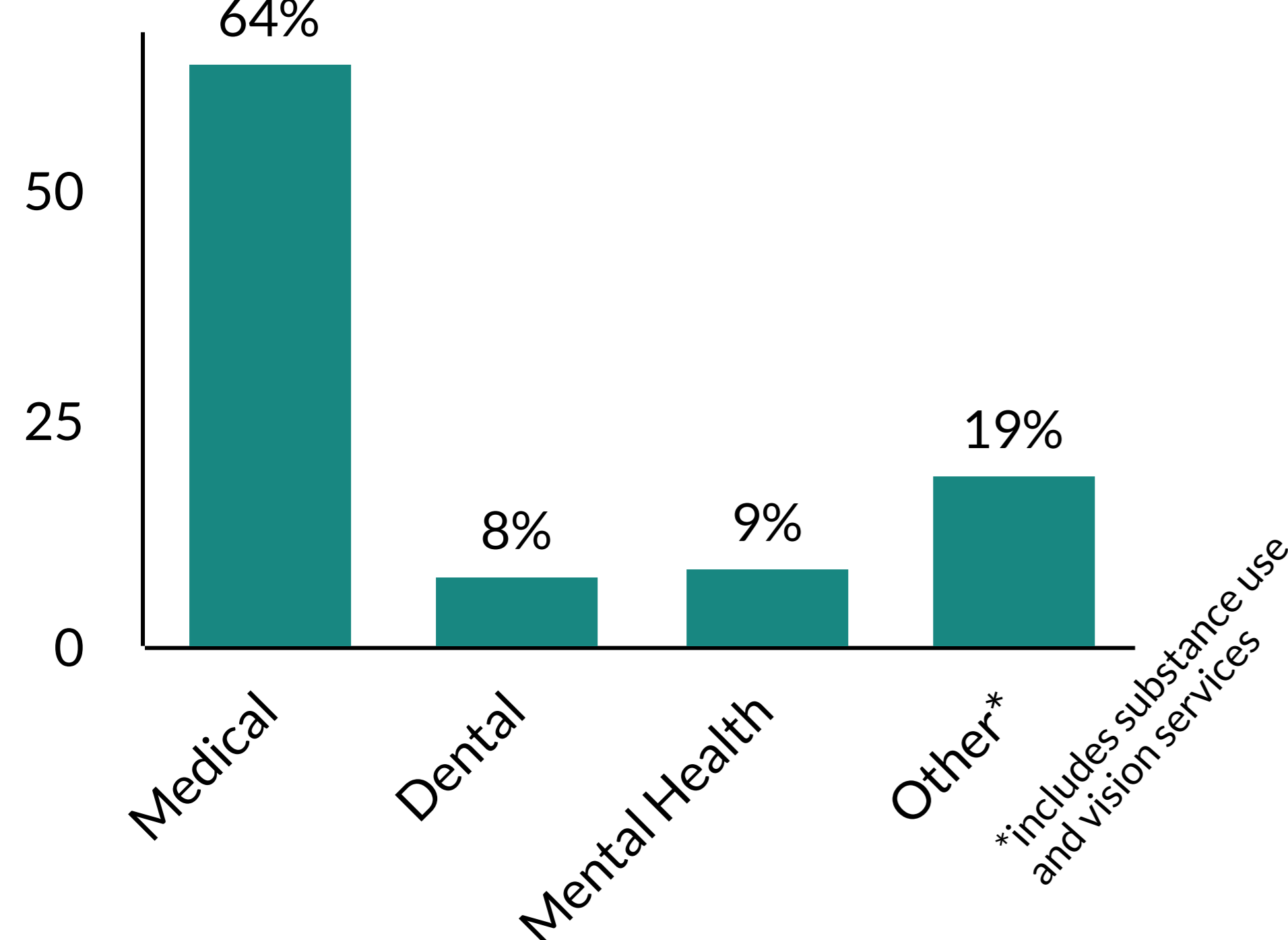

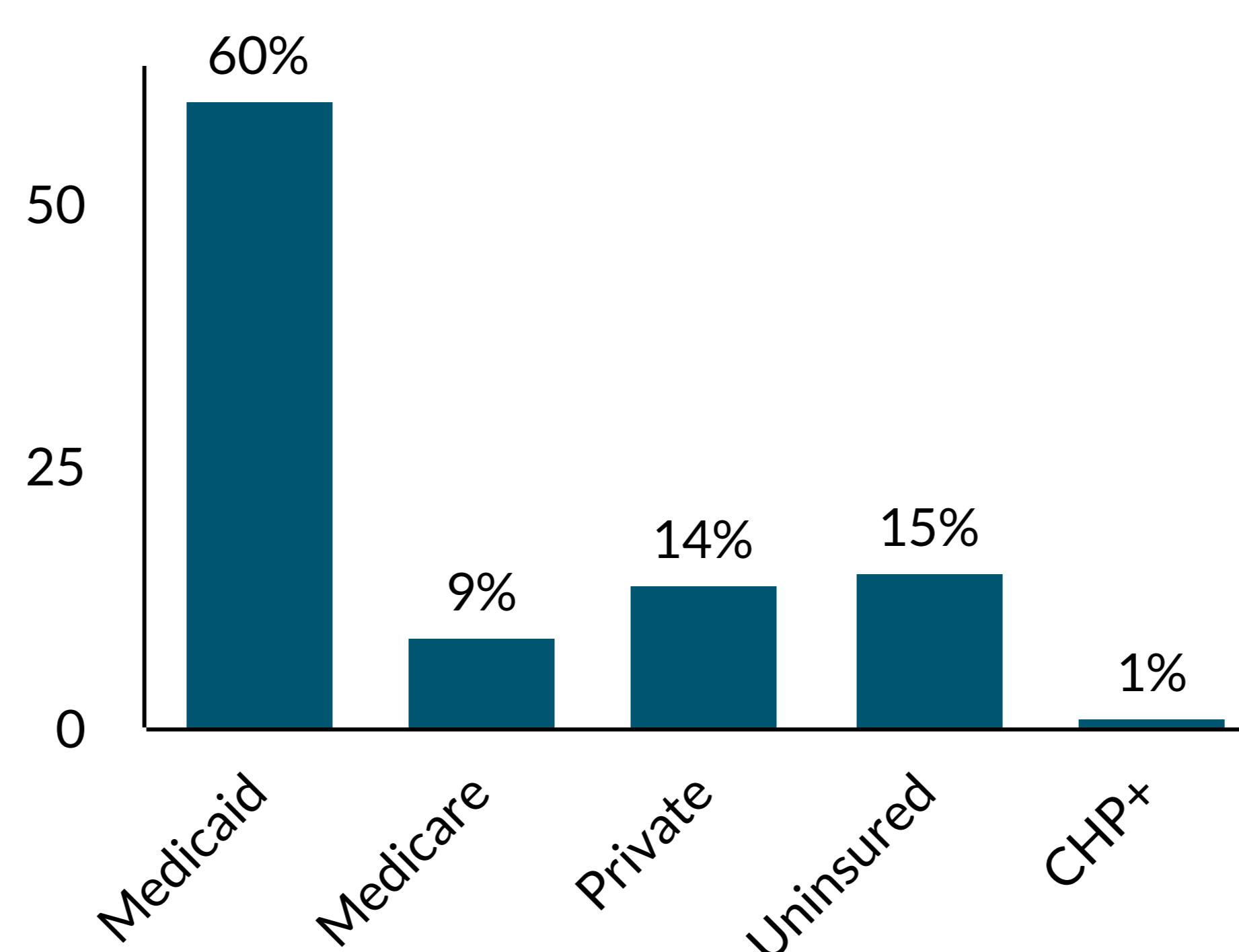

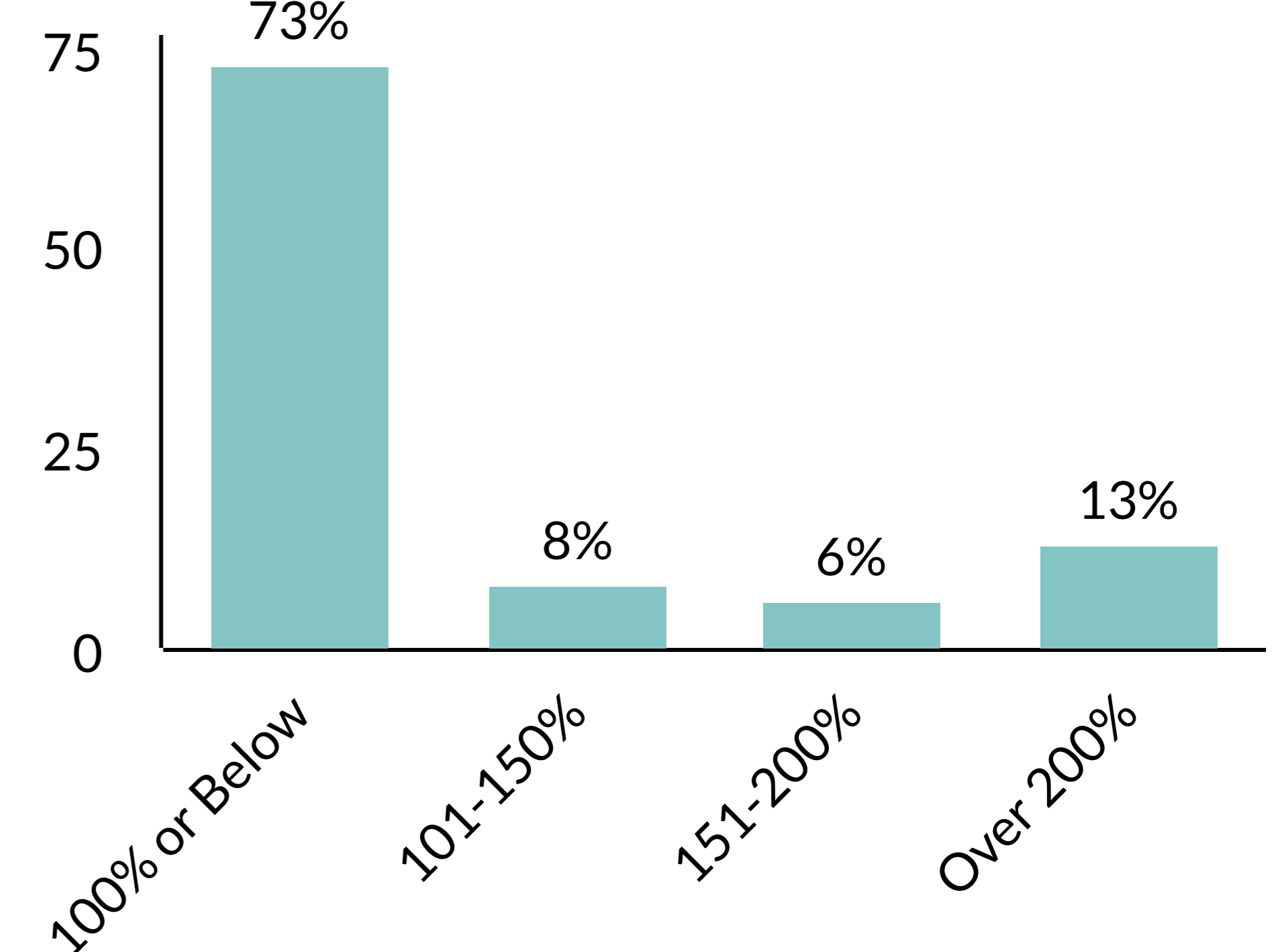

Pueblo Community Health Center (PCHC) was founded in 1983 with the mission to provide primary health care to those in need.

PCHC has 12 locations throughout Pueblo and Huerfano counties. This includes three School-Based Wellness Centers and a site at Pueblo Community College. The newest facility is a 64,000 square foot, zero energy clinic opened in January 2022. Located in the heart of Pueblo's East Side neighborhood, it is projected to serve an additional 5,000 patients over the coming decade.

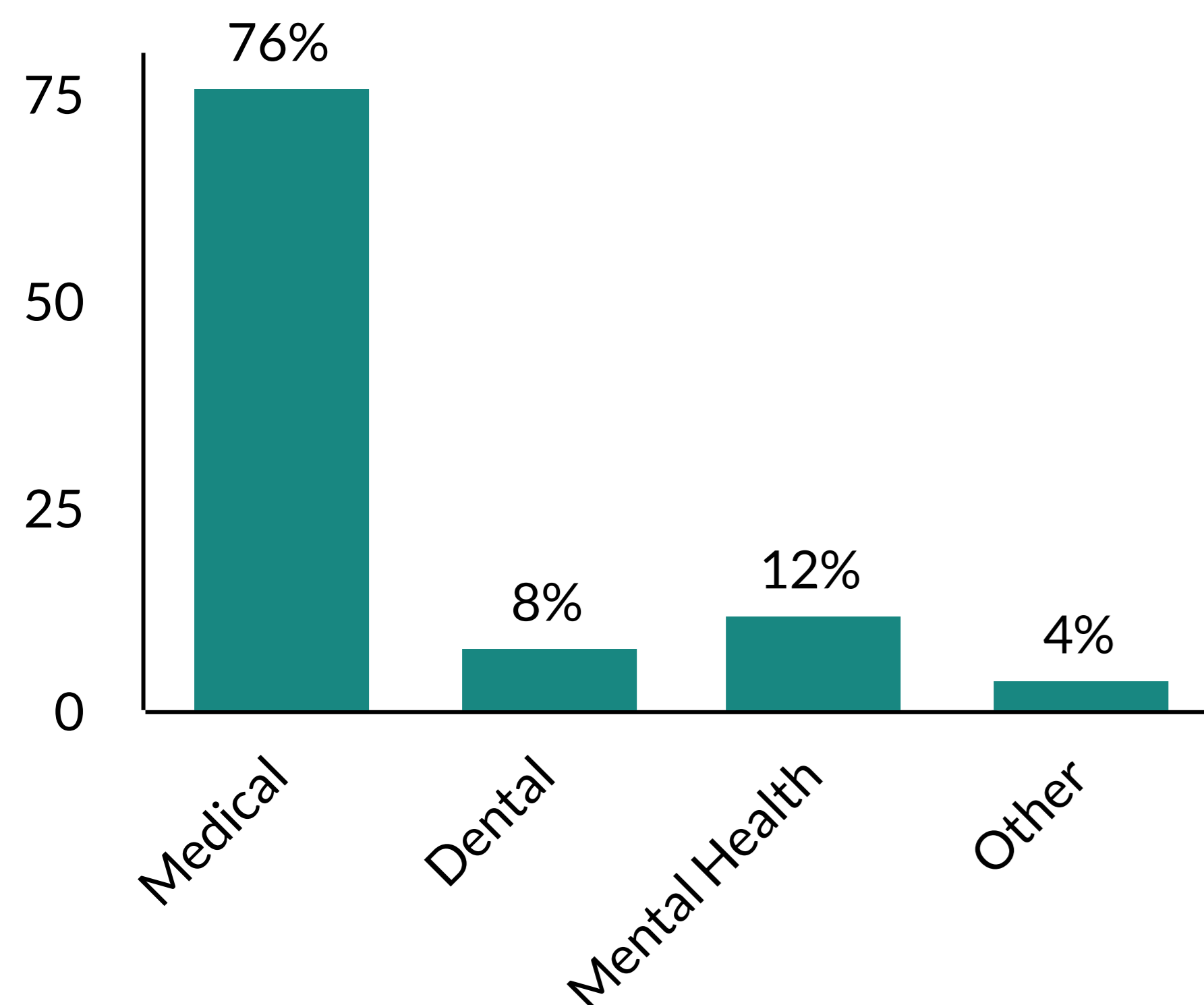

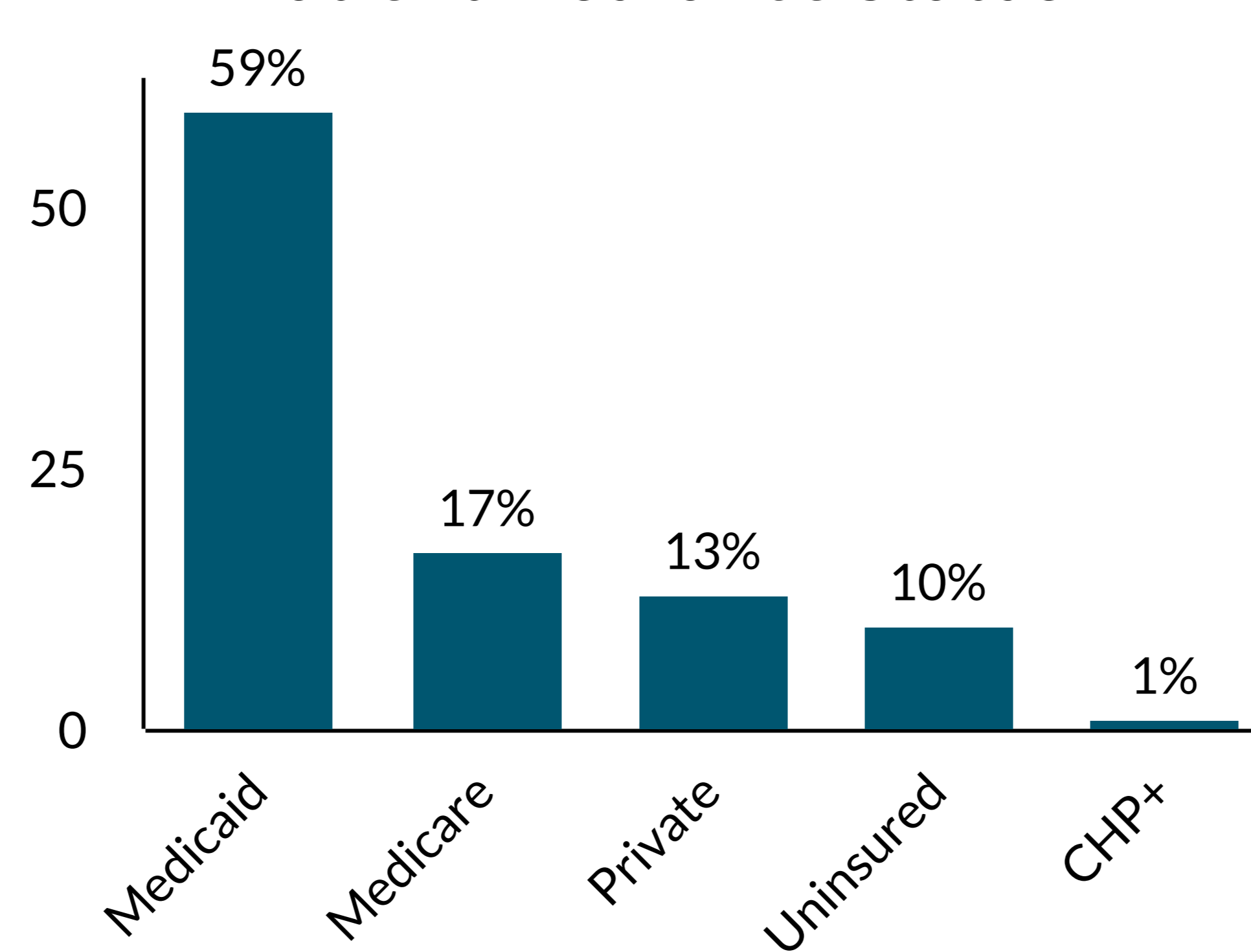

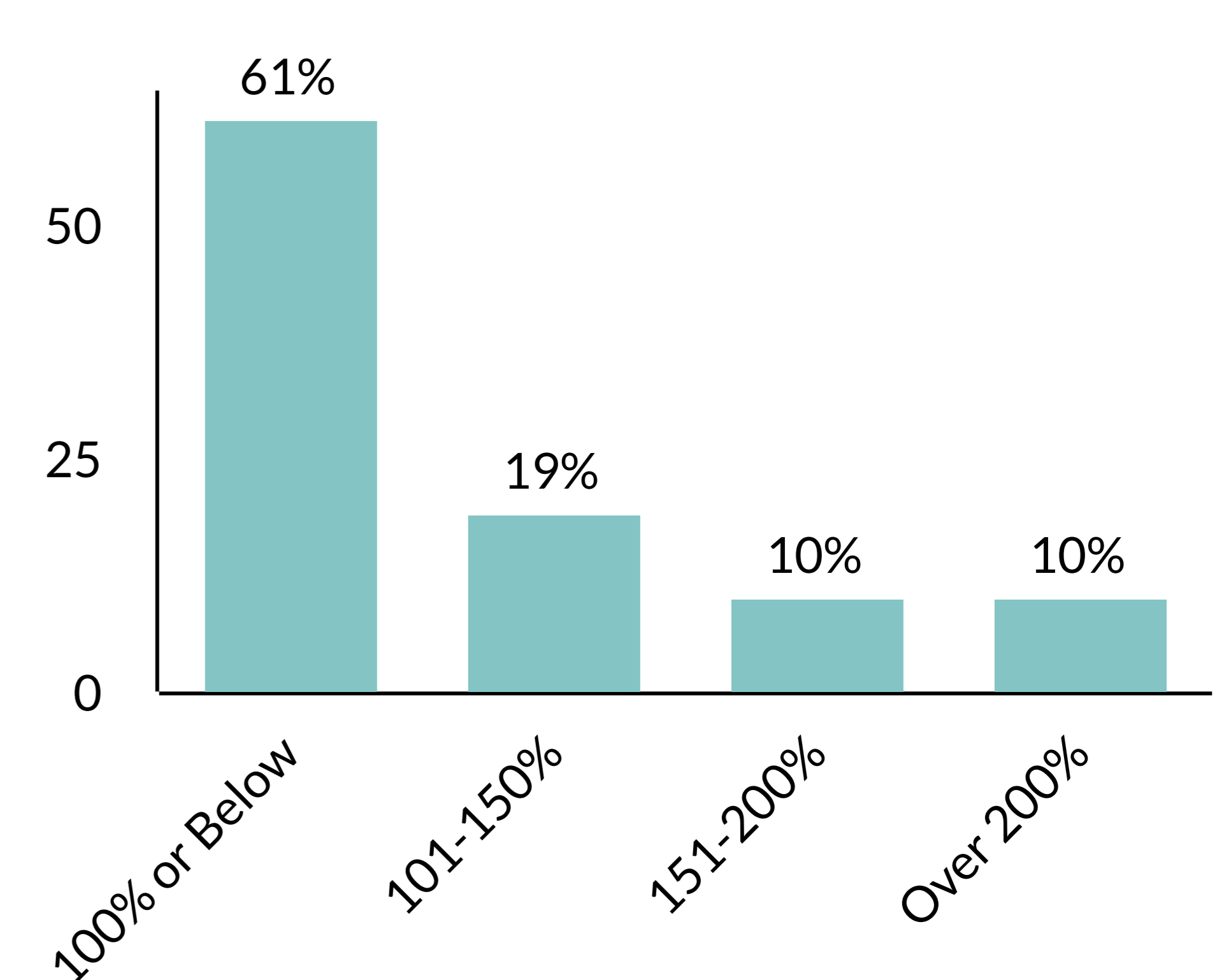

River Valley Family Health Centers (River Valley) serves east Montrose and Delta counties with three clinic locations in Montrose, Delta, and Olathe, with a total of 45 exam rooms, 10 dental operations, seven therapy rooms and two full service, in-house pharmacies. River Valley's service delivery model includes a wide range of medical, behavioral health, dental and support services across the lifecycles, including general primary medical care services, gynecological services, basic laboratory tests, screenings, immunizations, assistance with enrollment in Medicaid and the insurance marketplace, translation, and preventive health services.

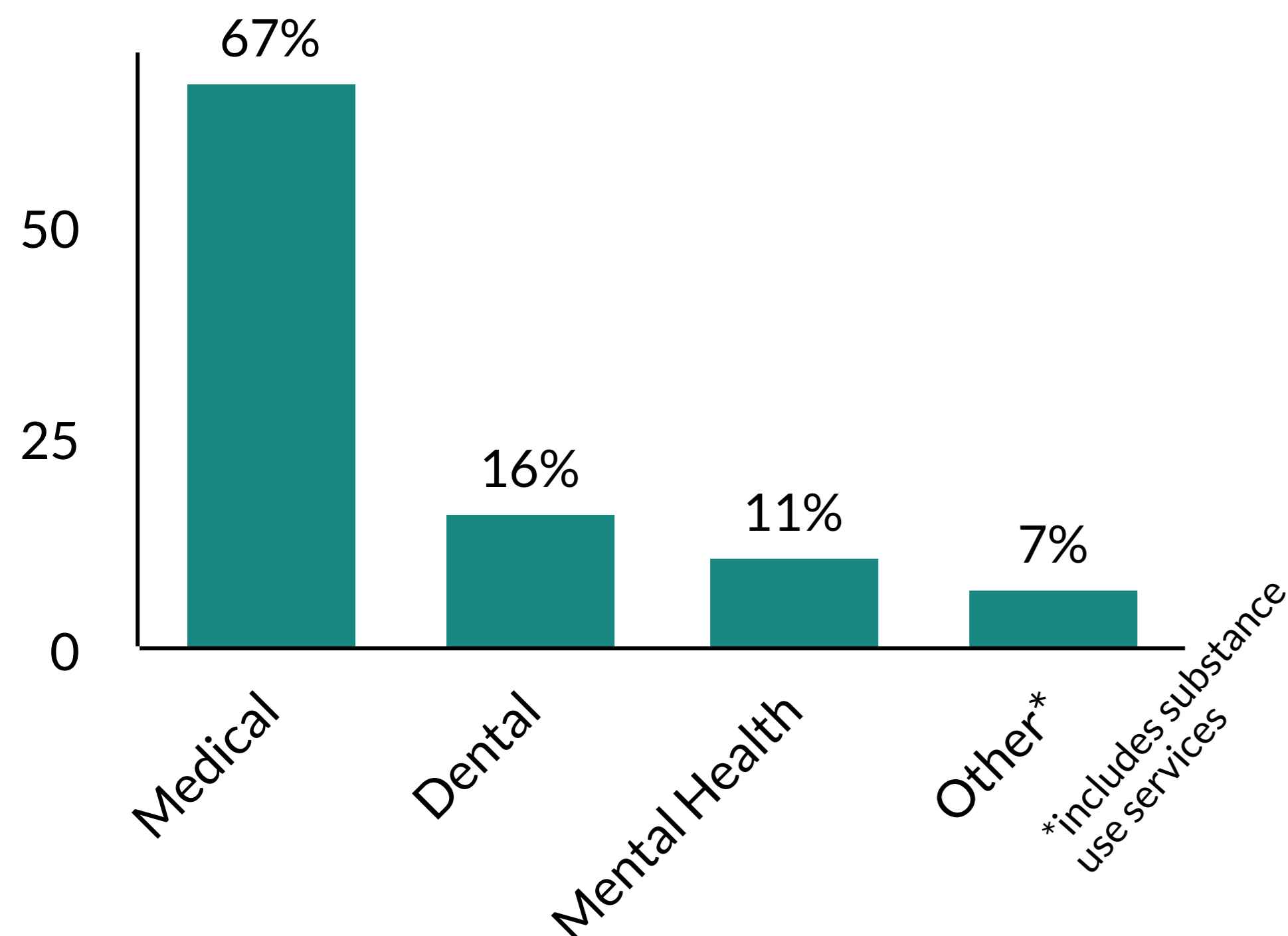

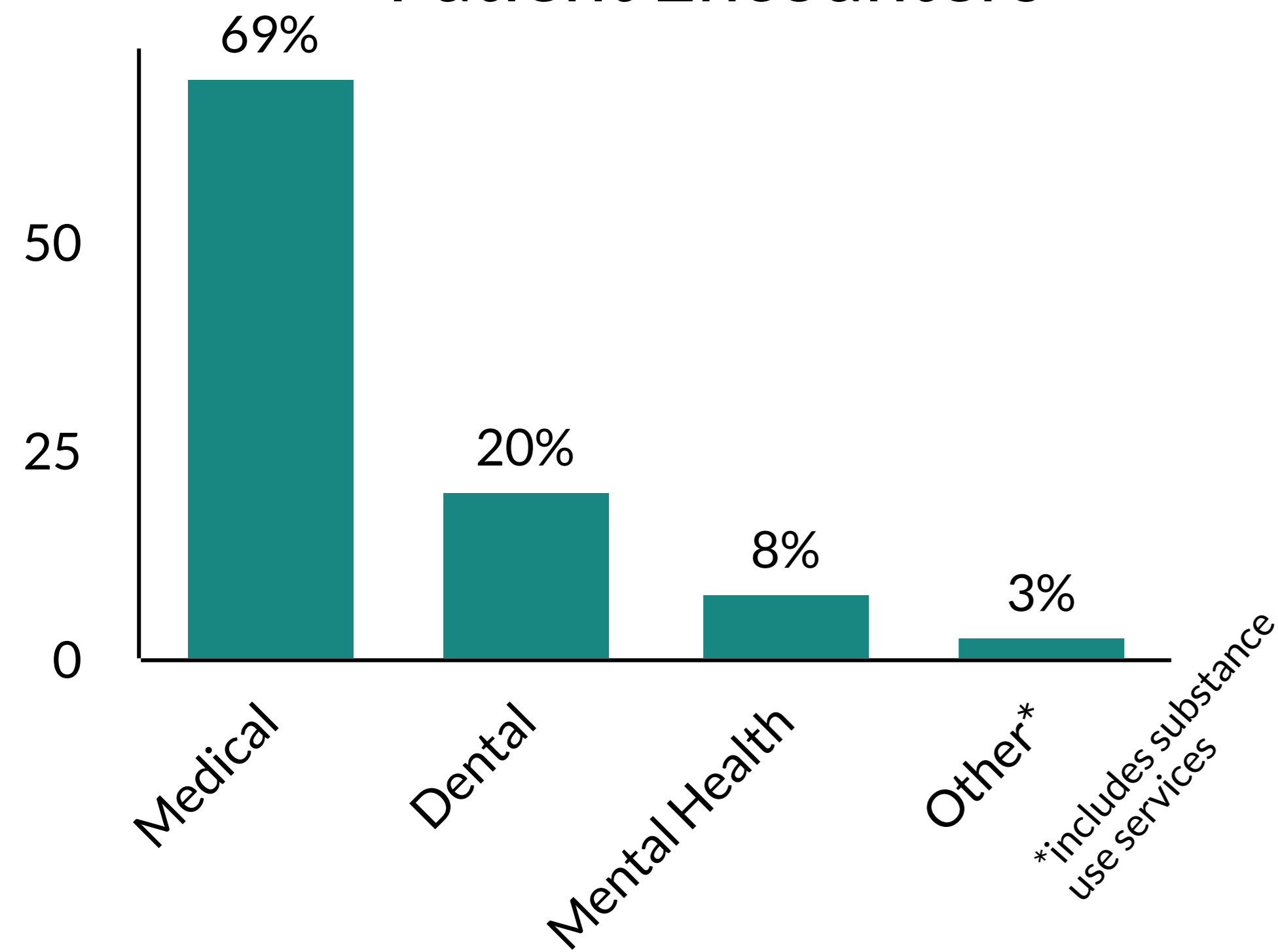

In 1989, STRIDE Community Health Center was established in response to the unmet health needs of the Denver Metro Area. The organization has grown into a large, integrated health care delivery system serving over 50,000 patients annually, from 15 brick-and mortar clinics, including four School-Based Health Centers, two on-site pharmacies, and one versatile street medicine team.

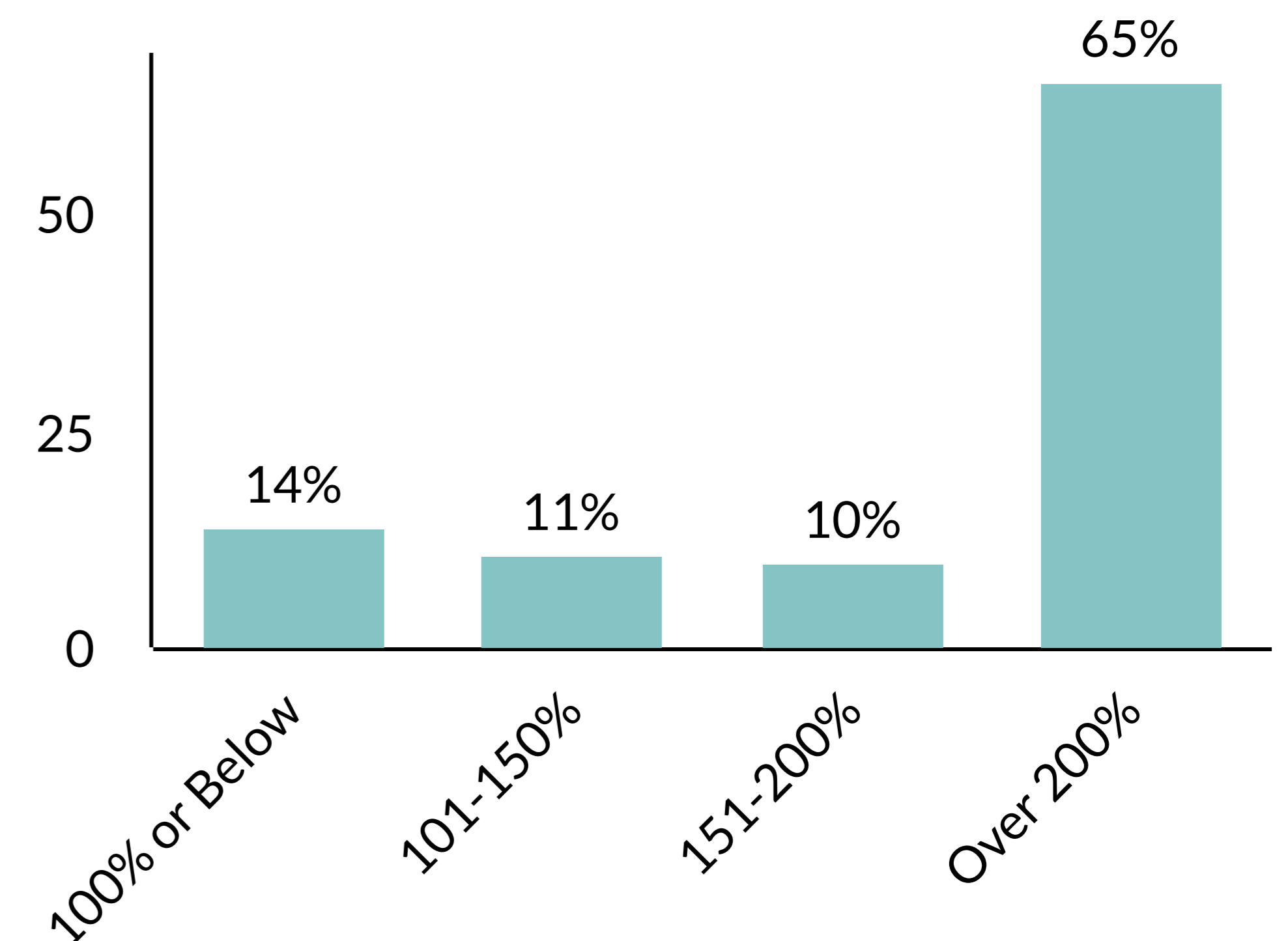

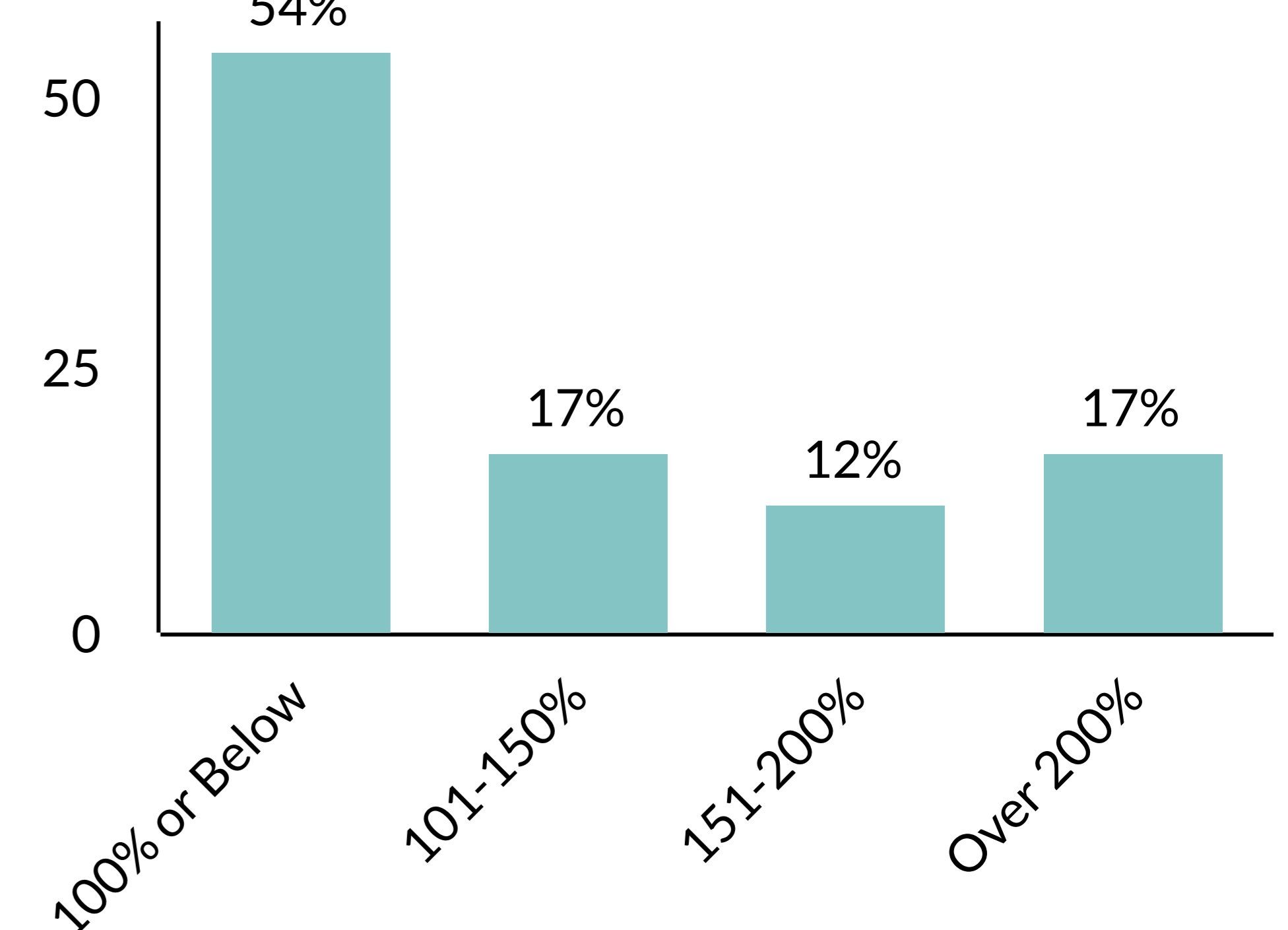
